

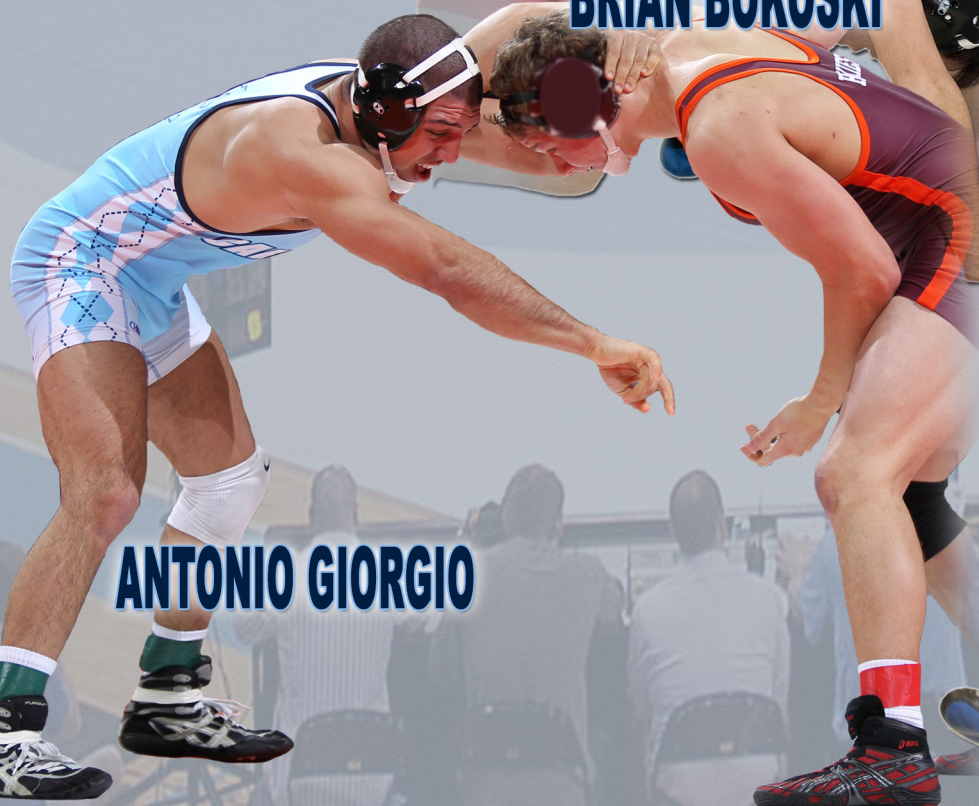

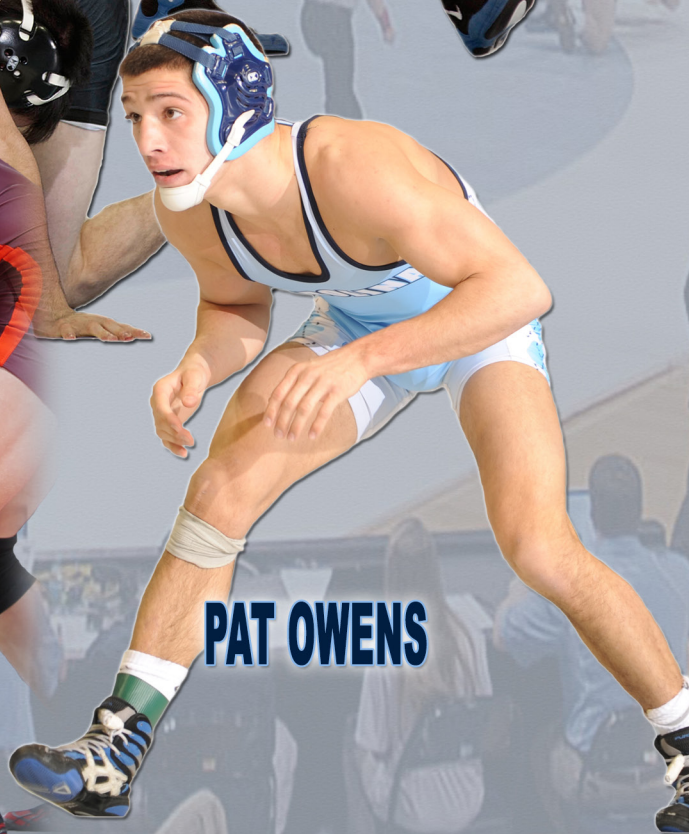

Supporting Carolina Wrestling

The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Nike, Inc. signed a new 10-year contract for Nike to be the exclusive supplier of athletic footwear, apparel and accessory products to the Tar Heels effective July 1, 2008. Nike will provide the athletic department with shoes, uniforms, coaching gear, balls and other equipment. In addition to the apparel and equipment, which constitutes the majority of the value of the contract, Nike will give the University \$2 million to the Chancellor's Academic Enhancement Fund. Chancellor Holden Thorp says he will direct the funds to faculty support. Nike will also provide support for team tours, travel and hosting regular-season tournaments in several sports. The athletic department will also receive \$1 million for signing the contract, with those funds being used to overhaul lighting and sound at the Dean E. Smith Center.

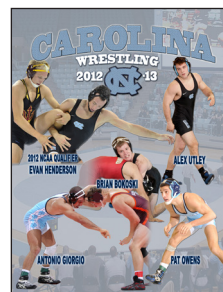

2012-13 SEASON PREVIEW



125 Pounds

Freshman Nathan Kraisser has emerged as one of the top recruits for the 2012-13 season as the Ellicott City, Md., native has laid claim to the starting spot at 125 pounds.

Junior Brian Bokoski provides depth and leadership for the Tar Heels at 125 pounds along with redshirt sophomore Jake Corrill.

Sophomore Jake Reienemund will redshirt during his first season as a Tar Heel after transferring in from Gardner-Webb.

133 Pounds

Another freshman looks to battle for a starting spot at 133 pounds as Cincinnati's Joey Ward looks to hold down the top spot throughout the year.

Sophomore Pat Owens returns after redshirting a year ago and will vie for the starting spot with Ward after starting as a freshman.

Junior Josh Craig will provide depth at the position along with a pair of freshmen in Luke Mario and Matt Williams.

141 Pounds

Sophomore Evan Henderson returns after earning a bid to NCAAAs as a highly-touted freshman. Henderson looks to make a run at All-America honors this season after posting a 28-13 record a year ago. The New Florence, Pa., product will look to lead by example this season for the young Tar Heels.

Redshirt sophomore Nick Heilmann could see action at 141 pounds during tournament action.

Also providing depth at 141 pounds will be freshmen Joe Moon and Cody Ross.

149 Pounds

Redshirt sophomore Nick Heilmann will battle for the starting spot at 149 pounds with redshirt freshman Christian Barber who posted a 24-16 mark during his redshirt season.

Heilmann went 9-9 a year ago and emerged as the starter at 149 late in the season.

Redshirt sophomore Derek Golner along with redshirt freshman Robert Henderson could also see time at 149 for the Tar Heels.

157 Pounds

At 157 pounds, the Tar Heels will turn to another freshman in Winchester, Va., native Jake Crawford.

Crawford battled injuries during the fall but looks to take hold of the starting spot at 157 pounds.

Virginia Tech transfer Chris Mears could also factor into the starting position after going 18-12 during his two years as a Hokie.

165 Pounds

Redshirt freshman John Staudenmayer has grabbed hold of the starting spot at 165 pounds after posting an impressive 23-9 mark last year during his redshirt campaign.

Freshman Scott Marmoll will also see time at 165 pounds during a redshirt season.

174 Pounds

Sophomore Frank Abbondanza was forced into spot duty during his freshman season as he filled in among the three heaviest weight classes but is now back to his more natural 174 pounds.

Tanner Eitel could also see time at 174 pounds after transferring in from Virginia Tech at the semester break.

184 Pounds

Sophomore Alex Utley took control of the starting spot at 184 pounds early during his freshman campaign and has not relinquished the position during his time as a Tar Heel.

Utley entered the top 20 rankings in the country for the first time during the fall season.

197 Pounds

Sophomore Antonio Giorgio returns to anchor down 197 pounds after redshirting a year ago. Giorgio spent time in the starting lineup during his freshman season with the Tar Heels.

Heavyweight

The Tar Heels enter dual season with three potential heavyweight wrestlers in sophomore David Woody, redshirt freshman Jake Barnhart and freshman Cody Klempay.

Klempay will get the early nod after recovering from an injury suffered during the fall season.

Barnhart returns after a redshirt season in 2011-12 where he missed the season due to injury.

Woody joins Carolina at the semester break after earning All-America status at Greco-Roman Junior Nationals in 2012.

C.D. Mock, a 1982 Carolina graduate, is entering his 10th season as head coach of the University of North Carolina wrestling program. The 2005 and 2006 Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year, Mock was named head coach on Sept. 30, 2002, and assumed the duties of head coach with the retirement of 30-year veteran Bill Lam following the 2002-03 season.

Upon his hiring, Mock led an immediate revitalization of the Carolina program by capturing back-to-back ACC titles in 2005-2006. Last season, the injury-riddled Tar Heels finished 7-8-1 overall and 2-3 in the ACC, which featured two of the top 20 teams in the country. Carolina also sent three qualifiers to the NCAA Championships and produced three ACC runner-ups in the 2009-10 season.

In 2005, Mock guided two-time All-America Evan Sola to a sixth-place finish at 133 pounds, which was good for a 24th-place team finish at the NCAA Championships and the Tar Heels' best national showing since 1997.

In addition, Mock has mentored 13 conference champions in his nine years as head coach.

Mock, who owns an 81-81-1 dual match record, has scheduled some of the nation's top teams over the last nine seasons and, along with his staff, has recruited some of the country's top high school talent to Chapel Hill. The Tar Heels 2011-12 and 2012-13 crop of newcomers were rated among the nation's best according to InterMat.

Prior to the 2003-04 season, Mock worked as an assistant coach for Lam for three years and was involved in all aspects of Carolina wrestling. He was an integral part of the 2003 Atlantic Coast Conference championship squad.

In 1982, Mock became Carolina's first NCAA champion and was one of the leaders of the Tar Heel team that finished fifth at the NCAA Championships. He finished that season a perfect 35-0 en route to the national title at 134 pounds and also received the prestigious Patterson Medal, which is presented to the UNC senior student-athlete that best demonstrates athletic excellence.



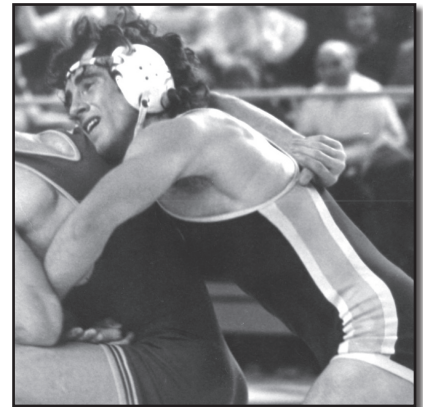
HEAD COACH C.D. MOCK

Mock won three ACC titles while at Carolina and was a two-time All-America. He posted a career record of 108-9, good for a .923 winning percentage, which ranks third all-time in Carolina history. He also had a career record of 64-4 in ACC competition.

Mock returned to his alma mater from Newtown, Pa., where he was the president of Equity Consultants Company and the wrestling coach at Council Rock High. In his first season back in Chapel Hill, the Tar Heels placed third in the ACC before posting a 14-5 mark and finishing second in the league in the 2001-02 season.

Mock wrestled for four seasons at Council Rock High School, in Newtown, Pa., where he won a state title in his senior season and graduated from Council Rock in 1978.

Mock lives in Chapel Hill with his wife, Mickie, son, Corey, and daughter, Chelsea. Mickie is a UNC graduate and was a member of the gymnastics team. She currently works for Duke Urgent Care as a physician's assistant. Chelsea is currently working as a nanny in Philadelphia and plans to attend culinary school. Corey has joined his father in Chapel Hill after spending a year at the U.S. Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, Colo., as a free-style wrestling resident athlete.

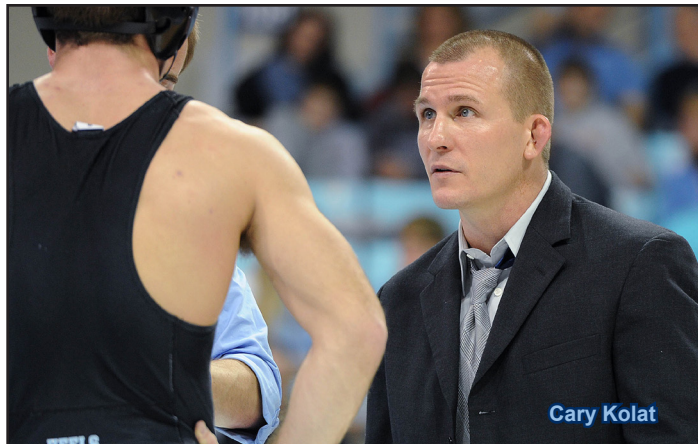
Cary Kolat, former two-time NCAA champion and member of the 2000 United States Olympic Wrestling Team, is in his third year as a member of the North Carolina coaching staff.

Kolat was elevated to the position of associate head coach over the summer and leads the training regimen of the Tar Heel wrestlers.

Kolat also serves as the director and head coach of the North Carolina Olympic Training Center based in Chapel Hill.

Kolat was on the UNC staff for two years in 2002-03 and has worked on collegiate staffs at Lehigh, Wisconsin, West Virginia and Lock Haven, his alma mater. In the previous two years Kolat was directing a private wrestling club in Maryland and operating Kolat.com, a wrestling training site.

Kolat won NCAA championships in 1995 and 1996 at Lock Haven and finished second as a freshman at Penn State in 1993. He finished his collegiate career with a 111-7 record. He went 137-0 in high school, winning four Pennsylvania state titles.

In addition to the 2000 Olympics in Sydney, Australia, Kolat competed for the United States in a dozen other international competitions.

In the summer of 2011, Kolat made a return to the mat in a competitive fashion and was a finalist at the U.S. Open and as a result took part in the 2012 U.S. Olympic Trials.

Kolat last competed in 2008 before his impressive run at the U.S. Open.

Trevor Chinn, a three-time NCAA qualifier at Lehigh University, is in his fourth season as an assistant wrestling coach at the University of North Carolina. Chinn works with the Tar Heels' middle weight groups and serves as head coach of the Carolina Wrestling Club and Tar Heel Terrorz youth club.

A 2009 graduate of Lehigh with a degree in physics, Chinn posted a 91-30 record over four seasons at 149 pounds. He qualified for nationals in 2006, 2008 and 2009 and won 29 and 30 matches, respectively, in his junior and senior seasons.

Prior to enrolling at Lehigh, Chinn was a two-time New York state champion at Canandaigua High School. He went 42-0 as a senior and was a four-time state finalist.

North Carolina wrestling head coach C.D. Mock announced the hiring of Dennis Papadatos as an assistant coach with the Tar Heel wrestling program on Oct. 18, 2012.

Papadatos will work with the upper weight classes at UNC after a very successful stint with Binghamton. Papadatos spent five years at Binghamton and helped produce 16 NCAA individual qualifiers and a pair of All-Americans.

Binghamton sent six wrestlers to the NCAA Championships in back-to-back years during his final two years before Papadatos stepped away from coaching following the 2010-11 season.

Prior to his time at Binghamton, Papadatos was an assistant coach at Northern Illinois where he spent the 2005-06 season as an assistant coach for the Huskies.

Papadatos spent three seasons working as an assistant coach at his alma mater, Hofstra.

As an undergraduate, Papadatos was a four-year starter for the Hofstra wrestling team - one of the East Coast's premier programs. During his tenure at Hofstra, Papadatos amassed 97 career victories en route to two appearances in the NCAA Division I wrestling championships at 157 pounds. He was also a three-time member of the Division I Academic All-America wrestling team (1999-2001).

A certified personal trainer, Papadatos graduated from Hofstra in 2000 with a degree in exercise physiology and completed a master's in health education from Hofstra in 2002.

A native of Long Island, N.Y., Dennis and his wife Angela are the proud parents of their four-year-old daughter Gabriella, two-year-old son Apostoli and infant son Yi-anni.

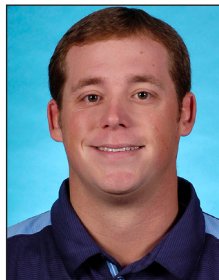

BUBBA CUNNINGHAM

Director of Athletics

Lawrence R. (Bubba) Cunningham is the director of athletics at the University of North Carolina. Chancellor Holden Thorp introduced Cunningham, who had been the director of athletics at The University of Tulsa for six years, on October 14, 2011, at a press conference at the Dean E. Smith Center.

Cunningham, 49, officially began his duties at Carolina on November 14, 2011, succeeding Dick Baddour. Cunningham is the seventh director of athletics in UNC history, following Robert A. Fetzer (1923-52), Chuck Erickson (1953-67), Homer Rice (1969-75), Bill Cobey (1976-80), John Swofford (1980-97) and Baddour.

Cunningham is in his 10th year as a Division I director of athletics. In addition to his tenure at Tulsa, he was the AD for three years from 2002-2005 at Ball State University.

From 1988-2002, Cunningham worked in the athletics department at the University of Notre Dame. Cunningham served as associate director of athletics for external affairs from 2000-02. He renegotiated the school's footwear contract, developed a communications and marketing plan, created marketing teams for all 26 varsity sports, increased corporate sponsorship income, created a financial/equity plan for the department and served as chairman of the NCAA Division I Women's Golf Committee.

Cunningham earned his bachelor's and master's degrees in business administration, both from Notre Dame, in 1984 and 1988, respectively. He played on the Irish golf team in 1982-83.

Cunningham serves on the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee, is a member of NACDA's Executive Committee, and was on the Board of Directors of the Alzheimers Association of Oklahoma and the Folds of Honor Foundation Board. Cunningham also served on the Gatorade National Advisory Board and has been a featured speaker at numerous NACDA and I-A institute conferences.

Born in Flint, Mich., and raised in Naples, Fla., Cunningham and his wife, Tina, have four children: Matthew, Michael, John and Sarah.



DR. BETH MILLER

Senior Associate Director of Athletics

Beth Miller is in her 29th year supervising North Carolina's highly-successful 26-team Olympic Sports program and serves as UNC's Senior Woman Administrator.

A native of Landis, N.C., Miller is a 1968 alumna of Appalachian State University with a B.S. degree in health and physical education. She has a master's from ASU and earned a Doctor of Arts degree in physical education at Middle Tennessee State in 1974.

From 1969-72, Miller served as the head volleyball and basketball coach at Appalachian State. She became head volleyball coach at UNC in 1975 and led the Tar Heels to four consecutive ACC titles from 1980-83 and five postseason tournament appearances. She also coached softball at Carolina from 1978-79.

In 1979, Miller was named UNC's Athletic Business Manager. She retired from coaching volleyball after 1983, but continued to handle all financial affairs for the department through 1987. She has overseen UNC's Olympic Sports program since 1985.

Miller serves on the NCAA Committee on Women's Athletics, as well as a number of Atlantic Coast Conference committees, including those for women's basketball, women's golf and volleyball. She chairs the ACC Awards Committee. Miller also is a member of UNC's Housing Advisory Board and the Enforcement and Response Protocol subcommittee of the UNC Campus Alcohol Task Force.

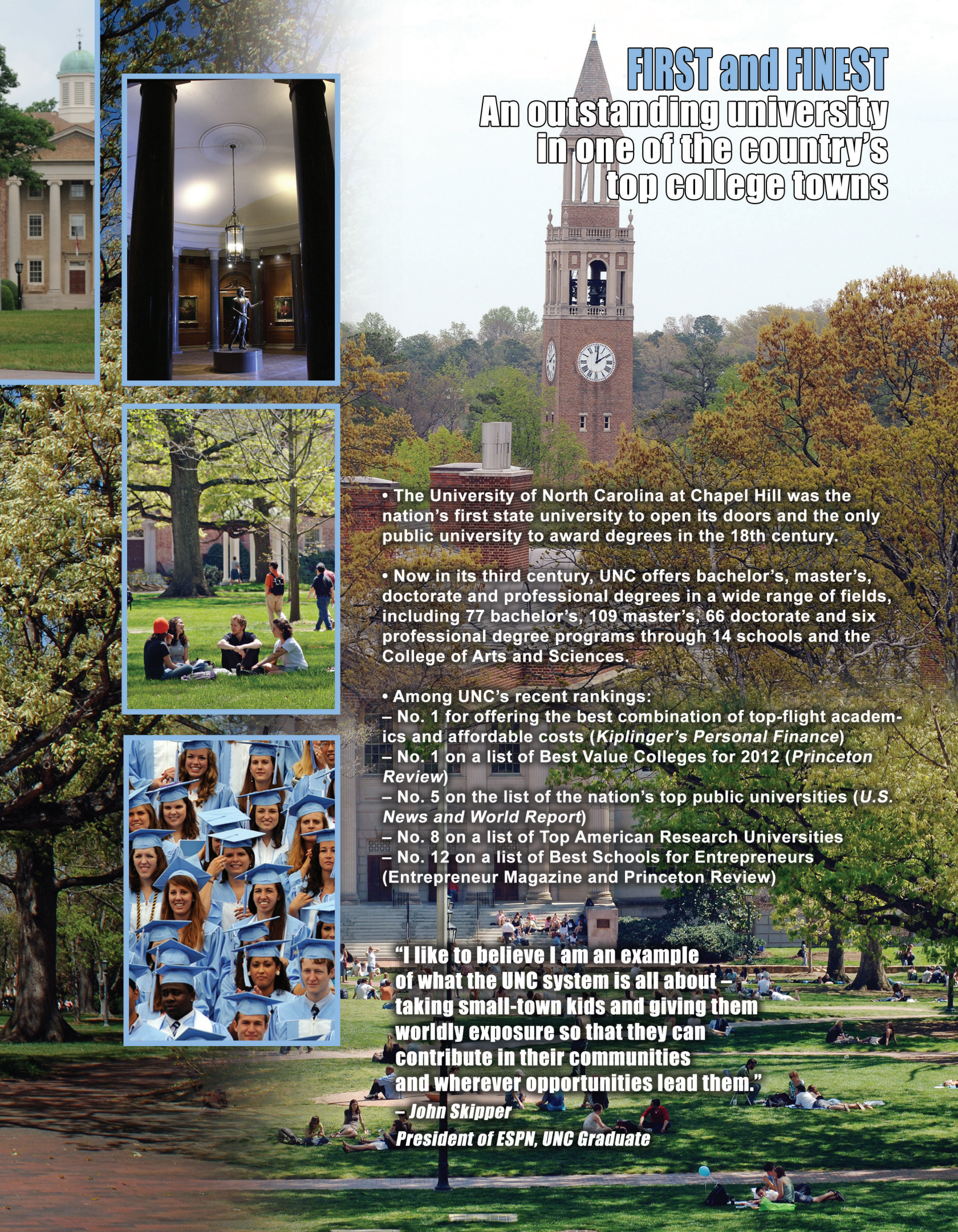

- The Academic Support Program assists Tar Heel student-athletes in exploring their interests and abilities, enjoying a broad educational experience, and reaching or exceeding their academic goals.

LOUDERMILK CENTER
FOR EXCELLENCE

- The Academic Support Program is housed in the Loudermilk Center for Excellence, a 150,000-square-foot facility that serves all of Carolina's nearly 800 student-athletes across 28 varsity sports. The Loudermilk Center's largest feature is the John W. Pope Student-Athlete Academic Support Center. This 29,000-square-foot facility provides classrooms for teaching and tutoring, study rooms and office space, as well as a writing lab and computer lab. It also houses the Baddour Carolina Leadership Academy, which offers leadership training for Carolina student-athletes, coaches and staff.

- During the 2011-12 academic year, 290 Carolina student-athletes earned spots on the ACC Academic Honor Roll, which is open to members of varsity squads who earn a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 for the year. In the fall of 2011, 129 student-athletes made the Dean's List, and 124 did so in the spring of 2012.

- The Academic Support Program helps freshmen transition from high school to college through a variety of academic programs such as academic counseling, individual tutoring, group review sessions and supplemental instruction.

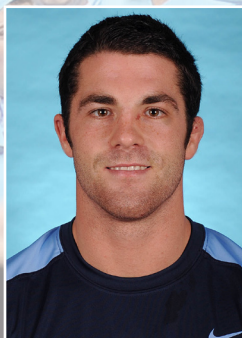

BADDOUR CAROLINA LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

UNC student-athletes have the opportunity to participate in the Carolina Leadership Academy. As the nation's premier leadership development program in collegiate athletics, the Carolina Leadership Academy develops, challenges and supports student-athletes, coaches and staff in their continual quest to become world-class leaders in athletics, academics and life.

The Carolina Leadership Academy provides comprehensive and cutting-edge leadership development programming through interactive workshops, 360-degree feedback, one-on-one coaching, peer mentoring and educational resources.

Developing World-Class Leaders for a Lifetime of Service and Success

The Carolina Leadership Academy consists of three programs:

CREED Program

Leadership training begins in the freshman year. All leadership begins with personal leadership, therefore freshmen are taught skills to effectively lead themselves. Training consists of monthly meetings featuring keynote speakers and small group discussion. Upperclass student-athletes serve as peer mentors and discussion leaders. Special focus is on responsibility, accountability, making good choices, ethics and character building.

Rising Stars Program

Designed for a select group of "high potential" sophomores and juniors, the program provides future leaders with insights, strategies and skills necessary to become effective leaders. The program includes monthly meetings, interactive exercises and action learning experiences.

Veteran Leaders Program

This program is designed for team captains and veteran student-athletes. It provides advanced leadership training and support, teaches the critical skills and insights necessary to be effective vocal leaders and provides a strong peer network. Student-athletes meet regularly to learn and reinforce leadership principles and share successes, frustrations and lessons.

WRESTLING TRADITION

• The Tar Heels have won 17 ACC titles in the last 37 years - meaning nearly half of the championship trophies from this stretch reside in Chapel Hill. UNC has finished among the top three teams in the ACC 33 times over this run.

• Carolina has finished in the top 20 at the NCAA Championships 14 times in the last 32 years.

• The Tar Heels have had 21 different wrestlers earn All-America honors a total of 38 times. UNC has had at least one All-America in 21 of the last 31 seasons.

• In 35 of the last 36 years, Carolina has had at least one ACC champion. The Tar Heels have had at least two conference champions in 28 of the last 32 years. Overall, UNC wrestlers have won 105 individual ACC crowns.

• Carolina has produced five individual national champions. In 1982, C.D. Mock went undefeated in 35 matches and won the NCAA title at 134 pounds. In 1988, Rob Koll went 41-1 and captured the NCAA crown at 158 pounds. Koll won the title despite wrestling with torn ligaments in his right knee - an injury he suffered in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

• T.J. Jaworsky captured three consecutive NCAA titles from 1993-95. As a senior in 1995, Jaworsky was 38-0 and was named the Most Outstanding Wrestler at the NCAA Championships. He still holds Carolina records for career falls, single-season falls, career winning percentage and single-season winning percentage. Jaworsky is the only three-time NCAA champ in ACC history.

• Carolina played host to the 1994 NCAA Wrestling Championships at the Dean E. Smith Center. More than 64,000 people attended the event's six sessions, including a championship crowd of 11,868.

• C.D. Mock was also Carolina's first All-America in 1979. Justin Harty and Rob Koll are the school's only four-time honorees, while Jan Michaels and T.J. Jaworsky were three-time All-Americans. Mock, Dave Cooke, Al Palacio, Doug Wyland, Shane Camera and Evan Sola each claimed All-America honors twice.

• In 1997, Justin Harty became the only Tar Heel wrestler to be a four-time All-America and four-time ACC champion.

• Tar Heels have been named Most Outstanding Wrestler at the ACC Championships on nine occasions. C.D. Mock was the first Carolina wrestler to earn the honor in 1979, while Evan Sola was the most recent in 2005.

• Fifteen Tar Heels - Stan Banks, Lenny Bernstein, Shane Camera, Enzo Catullo, Dave Cooke, Justin Harty, T.J. Jaworsky, Rob Koll, Jan Michaels, C.D. Mock, Bob Monaghan, Al Palacio, Bob Shriner, Jody Staylor and Doug Wyland - were named to the ACC's 50th Anniversary Team for wrestling in 2003. The squad represented the top 50 wrestlers in league history.

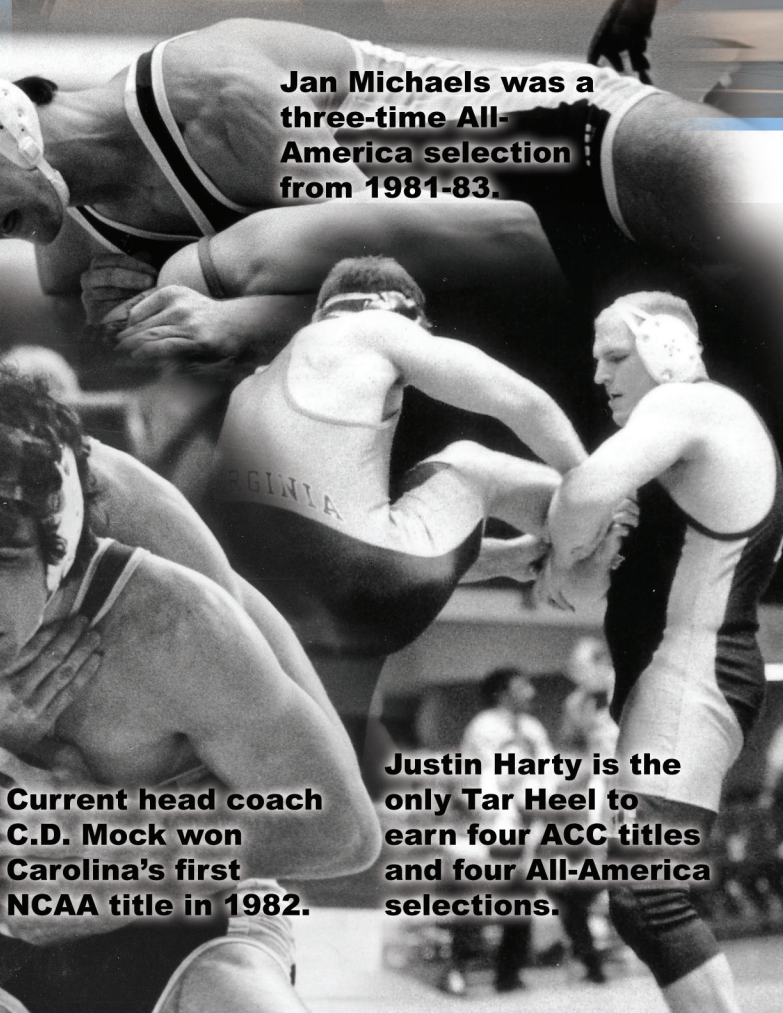

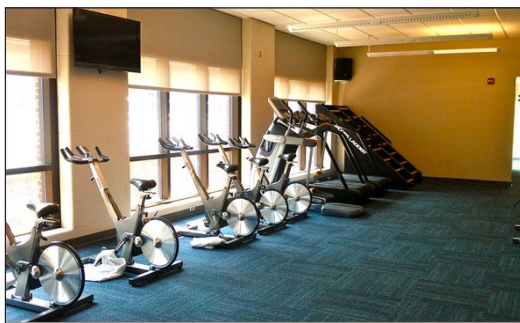
