■ **AT A GLANCE:** For the second consecutive week, North Carolina plays an in-state rival when the Tar Heels play host to NC State on Saturday, Nov. 29. The game will be televised by the ACC Network and will kickoff at 12:30 p.m. from Kenan Stadium.

Carolina (6-5 overall, 4-3 ACC) has won four of its last five contests, including last Thursday's 45-20 victory over No. 25 Duke. QB Marquise Williams accounted for four touchdowns and had 374 total yards of offense, while the UNC defense forced three turnovers to knock off its first ranked opponent since 2010.

This Saturday, Carolina will seek to extend its current two-game win streak over the Wolfpack. Head coach Larry Fedora is 2-0 against NC State.

Led by Williams, Carolina ranks second in the ACC and 19th in the country in scoring, averaging 36.7 points per game. Williams is second in the league in total offense, second in passing, second in scoring touchdowns and sixth in rushing.

QUICK HITS

- Carolina has won six or more games in seven straight seasons, including all three under head coach Larry Fedora.
- Carolina has accumulated 500 or more yards in four of the last six games, including a season-high 591 yards against Duke.
- Sophomore T.J. Logan became the first UNC tailback to run for 100 yards this season when he gained 116 at Duke last Thursday night. Logan has rushed 36 times for 208 yards in the last two games against Pitt and Duke.
- Carolina has scored five non-offensive touchdowns this season, which ranks second in the ACC. UNC has scored on three interception returns and two fumble returns.
- WR Quinshad Davis needs one TD reception to tie Hakeem Nicks' school record of 21.
- The Tar Heels have gained 553 yards on the ground in the last two games against Pitt (226) and Duke (315).
- With a healthy offensive line against Notre Dame, Georgia Tech, Pittsburgh and Duke, the Tar Heels posted 512, 579, 502 and 591 total offense yards, respectively.
- QB Marquise Williams is second in the league in total offense, second in passing, second in scoring TDs and sixth in rushing.
- Williams has been responsible for 200 points this season (20 passing TDs, 12 rushing TDs, one receiving TD, one two-point conv.), which ranks seventh in the country.
- Williams ranks second among FBS quarterbacks in scoring with 13 TDs (12 rush, 1 rec). Only Navy's Kenan Reynolds (17 TDs) has scored more.
- Carolina has scored 40 or more points in four of the last six games.

Former North Carolina defensive back Dre' Bly is one of 14 members of the 2014 College Football Hall of Fame class, announced in late May by the National Football Foundation. Bly will become the sixth player or coach from UNC, and first player since Don McCauley in 2001, to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame at the induction ceremony in December.

Bly will be honored at halftime of the NC State game.





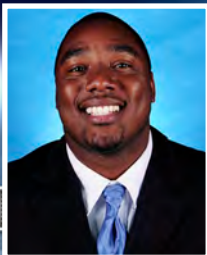

QUISE AT QB IN 2014

■ Junior Marquise Williams leads the Tar Heels in passing and rushing yards. This season, he has completed 234 of 369 attempts (.634) for 2,773 yards and 20 touchdowns. He leads the team with 726 rushing yards on 162 attempts.

■ Williams has been responsible for 32 touchdowns this year, a UNC single-season record. He has 20 touchdown passes and 12 rushing scores.

■ Williams has 3,499 total yards of offense, a single-season school record.

■ Williams' total of 4,598 career passing yards ranks sixth all-time at UNC and is 85 shy of Jason Stanicek (1991-94) in fifth place. Williams is fifth at UNC in total offense with 6,046 yards, 190 shy of Ronald Curry (1998-2001) in fourth place.

■ Williams has compiled five of the 12 highest single-game total offense performances in Carolina history. He set the UNC mark with 469 vs. ODU in 2013, had 435 vs. Notre Dame on Oct. 11, 2014, 463 vs. Georgia Tech on Oct. 18, 2014, 398 vs. Pitt on Nov. 15, 2014 and 374 vs. Duke on Nov. 20, 2014.

■ Williams set a school record for most total offense in two consecutive games with 898 (435 at Notre Dame and 463 vs. Georgia Tech) and most total offense in four consecutive games with 1,521 (Clemson, Virginia Tech, Notre Dame, Georgia Tech).

LEADING IN RUSHING AND PASSING YARDS

■ Williams is one of just seven players in the country leading his team in passing yards (2,773) and rushing yards (726). He also has two catches for 17 yards and touchdown this year.

PASSING TD, RUSHING TD, RECEIVING TD

■ Twice in his career Williams has had a passing touchdown, rushing touchdown and receiving touchdown in the same game. He first accomplished the feat against Virginia in 2013 and later did it again at Notre Dame in 2014. At least as far back as 2000, no other ACC player has accomplished the feat.

GAME-BY-GAME HIGHLIGHTS

■ **DUKE:** Accounted for four touchdowns and had 374 total yards of offense in beating the ranked Blue Devils • Completed 18 of 27 attempts for 276 yards and two touchdowns • Also rushed 21 times for 98 yards and two touchdowns • Eclipsed the single-season school record for total offense in the game • Set the record on a 19-yard pass to tight end Jack Tabb.

■ **PITTSBURGH:** Accounted for four touchdowns - three rushing and one passing - in a 40-35 victory • Completed 23 of 40 attempts for 276 yards and

one touchdown • Rushed 19 times for 122 yards and three touchdowns • Was the first time in his career that Williams rushed for three touchdowns in a game • Was his second 100-yard rushing game this season and the third of his career • Completed a school-record 16 consecutive passes at one stretch (previous single-game mark of 15 was set by Bryn Renner vs. Miami in 2013) • Completed just four of his first 16 attempts for 31 yards, but was 19 of 24 for 245 yards for the remainder of the game • Scored on runs of 23 yards, 2 yards and 45 yards and extended his UNC career record for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback to 19 • Became the first Tar Heel to score three times in a game this year • Set a UNC single-season record for most rushing yards by a quarterback bettering the previous mark of 541 by Jim Lalanne in 1940 • Compiled 398 yards of total offense.

■ **AT MIAMI:** Scored two rushing touchdowns and completed 22 of 32 pass attempts for 186 yards • Scored on a 10-yard scoring run in the third quarter and a 1-yard run in the fourth quarter • Failed to throw a touchdown for the first time since the ECU game - a string of five games.

■ **AT VIRGINIA:** Accounted for three of Carolina's four touchdowns in a 28-27 victory • Completed 15 of 28 attempts for 259 yards and two touchdowns and rushed 17 times for 49 yards and a score • His 52-yard touchdown run in the first quarter was the longest rush of his career and set the UNC career mark for rushing touchdowns by a quarterback • Accounted for 308 yards of total offense.

■ **GEORGIA TECH:** Completed 38 of 47 pass attempts for 390 yards and four touchdowns • Set the UNC record for completions in a game with 38 (previous was 33 by T.J. Yates vs. NC State in 2010) • Also set the UNC record for completions in consecutive games with 62 (previous record was 61 by Yates in 2010) • Broke the school record for completions in a half with 23 second-half completions (previous mark was 19 by Mark Maye and Bryn Renner (twice) • Attempted 47 passes, which equals the third-most in a game in UNC history • Threw for 390 yards, the eighth-most in UNC single-game history • Rushed for 73 yards and gained 463 yards of total offense, the second-most in UNC single-game history • Tied the UNC record for career rushing touchdowns (13) by a quarterback with Ronald Curry • Marked the fourth time in his career that Williams has thrown for more than 300 yards • Connected with Bug Howard on an 8-yard TD pass in the first quarter, threw touchdown passes to Ryan Switzer for 68 and 15 yards in the second quarter and tossed a 36-yard TD pass (on 4th-and-6) to Mack Hollins in the fourth quarter • Marked the third time in his career he has thrown four or more touchdowns in a game • Moved into 6th place at UNC with 31 career touchdown passes • Moved past Mike Thomas into seventh place in UNC history in career total offense yards with 4,771 • Moved past Scott Stankavage, Kevin Anthony and Mark Maye into ninth place in UNC history in career passing yards with 3,601.

■ **AT NOTRE DAME:** Was named the ACC Offensive Back of the Week • Completed 24 of 41 passes for 303 yards and two touchdowns • Rushed 18 times for a career-high 132 yards and a touchdown and caught a 23-yard touchdown pass from Quinshad Davis • Marks the second time in his career Williams has had passing, rushing and receiving touchdowns in the same game (also did it in 2013 against Virginia) • Became the first Tar Heel in school history and just the fourth player in ACC history to pass for 300 yards and rush for 100 in the same game • The other ACC players to accomplish the feat are: Brandon Connette of Duke and Woody Dantzler and Tajh Boyd of Clemson • It is only the sixth time a UNC player had 100 rushing yards and at least 200 passing yards • Recorded his second career 100-yard rushing game (previous rushing high was 104 last year against Duke) • Posted 435 total yards of offense • Moved past 3,000 passing yards and 1,000 rushing yards with his performance against the Irish • Is one of only two players in Carolina history to throw for over 3,000 yards and rush for over 1,000 yards in a career (Ronald Curry threw for 4,987 yards and rushed for 1,249 from 1998-2001) • Set a personal best with a 41-yard run •

The Notre Dame game marked the sixth time in his career Williams has thrown for at least one score and rushed for at least one score in the same game.

■ **VIRGINIA TECH:** Rushed a career-high 19 times for 94 yards • Completed 17 of 33 passes for 187 yards and a touchdown.

■ **AT CLEMSON:** Completed 24 of 38 attempts for 345 yards and four touchdowns • Was 15 of 23 for 307 yards and three scores in the second half • Marked just the second time in his career he has thrown for more than 300 yards • The four touchdowns are the second-highest single-game total in his career.

■ **AT EAST CAROLINA:** Completed 14 of 25 attempts for 127 yards and rushed 13 times for 37 yards.

■ **SAN DIEGO STATE:** Earned a helmet sticker from ESPN for his play in the win over San Diego State when he completed 20 of 29 passes for 255 yards and two touchdowns and was Carolina's leading rusher with 12 carries for 64 yards.

MORE ON MARQUEE

- Named ACC Offensive Back of the Week a league-best three times.
- ACC Rankings: total offense (2nd by just 0.3 yards per game), passing yards (2nd), scoring touchdowns (2nd), pass efficiency (fourth), rushing yards (6th) and total plays (1st).
- Only player in the ACC ranked in the top 10 in both passing (2nd) and rushing (6th).
- One of only seven players in the country leading his team in passing and rushing.
- One of only two QBs in ACC history with over 2,700 yards passing and 700 rushing in a season.
- Only QB in ACC history with 20 or more TD passes and 12 or more rushing TDs in a season. No other QB with 12 or more rushing TDs had more than 13 passing. Williams has 20.
- Responsible for a single-season school record 32 touchdowns (20 passing, 12 rushing), which is tied for 12th in ACC history.
- Ranks 10th in ACC history among QBs with 726 yards rushing this season.
- Tied for 6th in ACC history among QBs with 12 rushing touchdowns.

PLAYING AT KENAN STADIUM

North Carolina is 20-6 at Kenan Stadium since 2011 (6-1 in 2011, 6-1 in 2012, 4-3 in 2013, 4-1 in 2014). The Tar Heels are 14-5 at Kenan Stadium under Larry Fedora.

CAROLINA-NC STATE SERIES NOTES

- North Carolina leads the series with NC State, 65-32-6, and has won two in a row against the Wolfpack, both under the direction of head coach Larry Fedora.
- Carolina defeated the Wolfpack 43-35 in 2012 on Giovani Bernard's 74-yard game-winning punt return with 13 seconds remaining. Last year, the Tar Heels earned their first win at Carter-Finley Stadium since 2005 with a 27-19 victory.
- The Carolina-NC State series is the fourth-most-played in ACC history. Carolina is part of four of the five most-played series in ACC history.
- The team that has held the rushing advantage has won 19 of the last 22 meetings. The lone exceptions came in 2004 when Carolina won 30-24, but was outgained on the ground, 304-164; in 2009 when Carolina had 159 rushing yards to NC State's 76 in a 28-27 Wolfpack victory; and last year when State held a 212-152 advantage in rushing.

ANOTHER EARLY START

This is the 10th consecutive season Carolina and NC State have played their rivalry game at either noon or 12:30 dating back to 2004. In 2004, the game was played at 6 p.m. and Carolina won 30-24 when the Tar Heels forced a fumble on NC State's T.A. McLendon as he attempted to cross the goal line. Defensive end Tommy Davis made a stop on the previous play to prevent McLendon from crossing the goal line.

CAROLINA COMEBACKS: WINNING LATE WITH BIG PLAYS

■ Carolina has made a habit of making memorable plays late in games to win this year. Four of the Tar Heels' six wins this year required late game heroics, including:

- vs. San Diego State:** Safety Tim Scott sealed the win with a lunging interception in the end zone with just 14 seconds left in the game. The interception was Scott's eighth as a Tar Heel.
- vs. Georgia Tech:** After the Yellow Jackets took a 43-42 lead on a 75-yard run with 3:07 to play, Carolina calmly marched down the field and scored on a T.J. Logan 2-yard run with 11 seconds to play.
- at Virginia:** QB Mitch Trubisky threw a 16-yard touchdown pass on his only play of the game to give North Carolina its first lead with 4:05 remaining. The Tar Heels then executed a perfect outside kick and were able to run out the clock. Trubisky was in the game because Williams' helmet had come off on the previous play.
- vs. Pittsburgh:** Trailing 35-34 after a James Conner 22-yard touchdown run with 3:33 remaining, Carolina drove 75 yards and scored on a T.J. Logan 1-yard run with 50 seconds left.

RED ZONE EFFICIENCY

■ Carolina ranks second in the ACC and 19th in the country in red zone efficiency, scoring on 89.4 percent of its opportunities. The Tar Heels have scored on 42 of 47 opportunities in the red zone, including 36 touchdowns and six field goals. Carolina is perfect at home (20 for 20) in red zone chances and 22 of 27 on the road. The only five times Carolina failed to score came on an interception at Clemson in the closing minutes, a 32-yard missed field goal at Notre Dame, running out the clock at Virginia and two fumbles at Duke.

POSTGAME NOTES VS. DUKE

• North Carolina improved to 6-5 overall and 4-3 in ACC play with a 45-20 win over No. 25 Duke. The win snapped Carolina's two-game losing streak in the series. It was head coach Larry Fedora's first win over Duke. With the sixth win, the Tar Heels became bowl eligible for the second straight season under head coach Larry Fedora.

• The win is Carolina's first over a ranked team under head coach Larry Fedora and the first since a 37-35 victory at No. 24 Florida State in 2010. The 25-point win is the largest over a ranked team since a 38-12 win over No. 24 Connecticut in 2008.

• The Tar Heels gained a season-high 591 yards, the fourth time in the last six games UNC has gained at least 500 yards (521 at Notre Dame, 579 vs. Georgia Tech, 502 vs. Pitt and 591 at Duke).

• Carolina has scored 40 or more points in six of its 11 games this season and in 15 of 36 games under head coach Larry Fedora.

• Quarterback Marquise Williams completed 18 of 27 attempts for 276 yards and two touchdowns. He also rushed 21 times for 98 yards and two touchdowns.

• T.J. Logan rushed for 116 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries. It is the first time this year a Carolina running back has rushed for more than 100 yards. (Quarterback Marquise Williams has done it twice this year.) It was the 40th time – and 10th time in the last 11 years – a Carolina player has rushed for 100 or more yards against Duke.

• Logan has rushed 36 times for 208 yards in the last two games against Pitt and Duke. Prior to Pitt, Logan had a combined 17 rushes for 35 yards against Miami and Virginia and rushed for a combined 135 yards in the previous six contests.

• Tailback Romar Morris rushed 17 times for 95 yards. His previous highs this year were nine carries twice and 46 yards against East Carolina. Morris had gained 85 yards rushing in his previous six games combined.

• Carolina rushed 57 times for 315 yards, its highest single-game mark in both categories this year. Previous highs were 48 rushes against Liberty and 238 yards against Pitt. It is the most rushing yards since gaining 339 on the ground vs. Virginia Tech in 2012.

• The Tar Heels have gained 553 yards on the ground in the last two games against Pitt and Duke. Those follow games at Virginia and Miami in which UNC rushed for just 99 and six yards, respectively.

• Quinshad Davis caught a 3-yard touchdown pass to give the Tar Heels an early 14-0 lead. Davis moved into sole possession of second place in UNC history with 20 career touchdown receptions. He trails only Hakeem Nicks (21).

• Safety Tim Scott scored on a 10-yard fumble return in the first quarter after a scooping up a fumble by Duke quarterback Anthony Boone. Defensive tackle Nazair Jones forced the fumble, the first of his career. It is the second defensive touchdown of Scott's career. He scored on an interception return against Georgia Tech in 2012.

• The fumble return touchdown was the Tar Heels' fifth defensive touchdown of the season, which ranks second in the league behind Georgia Tech. Carolina has three interception return touchdowns and two fumble return touchdowns.

• Mack Hollins made his ACC-leading eighth touchdown catch of the season on a 1-yard pass from Williams.

• Carolina's 21 first-quarter points are a season high. UNC did not score in the first quarter in either of its previous two games at Miami and Pitt.

• Wide receiver Ryan Switzer had three receptions for 109 yards. It is the second 100-yard receiving game of the season and the third of his career.

• Thomas Moore's 30-yard field goal was the longest for the Tar Heels this season. The previous long was 23 yards. It was Carolina's sixth made field goal this year.

• Carolina's defense allowed just 378 yards, the second-fewest by an opponent in its seven ACC games and third-fewest in 11 overall contests. Only Liberty (346) and Virginia Tech (357) gained fewer yards.

• Nazair Jones had two and a half tackles for losses among his team-high six tackles and forced a fumble and batted down a pass.

GAME TIME NOTE

■ The Duke game is Carolina's fifth night game of the season, which is the most since 2000 and is believed to be the most in school history. Seven of Carolina's 11 games this season have started at 3:30 p.m. or later.

DAVIS CLIMBING THE CHARTS

■ Junior wide receiver Quinshad Davis has five touchdown catches this year. He is second in school history with 20 touchdown receptions, trailing only Hakeem Nicks (21 from 2006-08). Davis has 144 career catches, which ranks ninth in UNC history. He is two shy of Sam Aiken for eighth place.

■ After going without a catch for the first time in his career against Miami, Davis responded with six catches for 66 yards in the win over Pitt. He had a 23-yard catch on UNC's final scoring drive to set up

T.J. Logan's 1-yard touchdown run.

■ Davis threw his third career touchdown pass to Williams late in the third quarter at Notre Dame, a 23-yard scoring play to give Carolina the lead. Davis also threw touchdowns against Virginia (to Williams) and East Carolina (to T.J. Thorpe) in 2013. He has completed all three pass attempts of his career for touchdowns.

■ Davis became just the third player in UNC history to have double digit touchdown receptions in a season when he posted 10 in 2013. Only Dwight Jones (12 in 2011) and Nicks (12 in 2008) have had more in a single season.

HOLLINS MAKING AN IMPACT

■ A year ago, wide receiver Mack Hollins was a special teams captain as a walk-on freshman. This year, the Rockville, Md., native is an integral part of the Tar Heels' offense. Hollins has 33 catches for 606 yards and an ACC-best eight touchdowns.

■ He is tied for first in the ACC and 19th in the country with eight TD catches. Hollins is fifth in the ACC and 24th in the country, averaging 18.4 yards per reception.

■ Hollins had a 57-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter and a 63-yard scoring catch in the second quarter in the win at Virginia. He has three of the six longest pass receptions by a Tar Heel this season.

■ Hollins had a career-high 120 yards receiving at Virginia – all coming in the first half. He also recovered an onside kick by Nick Weiler with under four minutes to play, moments after UNC had taken its first lead of the game at 28-27.

■ His 91-yard touchdown catch from Williams vs. SDSU is the longest by a Tar Heel in Kenan Stadium history. It was also the third-longest pass play at any venue in school history.

■ Hollins made his first two career receptions for 40 yards, including a 33-yard touchdown in the third quarter vs. Liberty. The 33-yard catch-and-run down the left sideline was the go-ahead score that gave Carolina a 28-22 lead with 5:55 to play in the third quarter.

■ Against Clemson, Hollins caught two passes for 30 yards and an acrobatic 17-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

■ At Notre Dame, Hollins caught an 18-yard touchdown pass with 47 seconds to play in the fourth quarter. Hollins led the Tar Heels with six catches for 84 yards against the Irish.

SWITZER LEADS TEAM IN RECEPTIONS

■ WR Ryan Switzer leads the team with 50 receptions and 672 yards this season. He is fifth in the ACC with 4.5 receptions per game and sixth with 61.5 receiving yards per game.

■ Switzer has 33 punt returns for 167 yards, including a long of 30.

■ Switzer had three receptions for 109 yards vs. Duke. It is the second 100-yard receiving game of the season and the third of his career.

■ Switzer had a 63-yard scoring catch-and-run in the third quarter vs. Pitt. It was his fourth scoring reception of the season. Switzer now has three of the Tar Heels' longest scoring receptions this year. He had a 75-yarder at Clemson and a 68-yarder vs. Georgia Tech.

■ Switzer matched his career-high with nine receptions for 44 yards in the loss at Miami. He also had nine earlier this year against Georgia Tech.

■ Switzer caught three passes for 87 yards against Clemson, including a 75-yard catch-and-run

for his first touchdown of the season.

■ Switzer had a career-high nine receptions for a career-high 136 yards and two touchdowns in the win over Georgia Tech. It was the second 100-yard receiving game of his career. He had 118 vs. Old Dominion in 2013. It was also the second time he caught two TD passes in a game (had two against Old Dominion last year).

CREATING TURNOVERS

■ The Tar Heels have forced 23 turnovers this season. UNC has intercepted 12 passes and returned three of them for touchdowns. The Tar Heels have recovered 11 fumbles and returned two for touchdowns. Carolina ranks 17th in the nation in turnovers gained, 14th in fumble recovered and 23rd in interceptions. Last year, Carolina was 71st in the nation in turnovers gained. Carolina has intercepted at least one pass in eight of 11 games this year. The Tar Heels are 42nd in turnover margin.

THORPE'S COMEBACK

■ Junior T.J. Thorpe has broken his right foot three times during his career. He missed the entire 2012 season after injuring it in training camp. He broke the foot again in February, 2013, missing all of spring practice. He played in 2013 and finished with 24 catches for 267 yards and two touchdowns. Expected to be a major contributor this season, Thorpe broke the foot for the third time on the second day of training camp this year.

■ Thorpe missed the first two games, but returned to action against East



BLY HEADED TO COLLEGE FOOTBALL HALL OF FAME



Former North Carolina defensive back Dre' Bly is one of 14 members of the 2014 College Football Hall of Fame class, announced in late May by the National Football Foundation. Bly will become the

sixth player or coach from UNC, and first player since Don McCauley in 2001, to be inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame at the induction ceremony in December.

"This is a tremendous honor and I'm thrilled to represent the University of North Carolina in the College Football Hall of Fame," said Bly. "It's a dream come true that hasn't really sunk in yet. I was fortunate to play with a great group of guys in Chapel Hill who pushed me every day to become a better player. We had one of the best defenses in the country with future NFL players all over the field. I wouldn't

be accepting this honor without them and the great coaching staff under the leadership of Mack Brown."

Bly had a brilliant career in Chapel Hill from 1996-98, helping lead the Tar Heels to back-to-back Top 10 finishes and three consecutive bowl victories. The Chesapeake, Va., native remains the only player in Atlantic Coast Conference history to earn first-team All-America honors in his first three seasons.

In 1996, Bly became the first freshman defensive player in college football history to earn consensus first-team All-America honors. That season, the Tar Heels went 10-2, beat West Virginia in the Gator Bowl and finished No. 10 in the Associated Press Top 25 poll. Bly led the nation as a freshman with 11 interceptions in the regular season and added two more pass thefts in the bowl game. He was named first-team All-America by the Associated Press, The Sporting News, the Football Writers and the Walter Camp Foundation.

When Bly repeated consensus honors in 1997, he became the first two-time consensus All-America in UNC football history. Carolina claimed an 11-1 record and a No. 4 ranking in the coaches poll and No. 6 ranking by the AP. Bly was part of a Carolina defense that finished among the top five in all major categories, including pass defense, run defense and total defense.

In 1998, Bly was named first-team All-America by the Walter Camp Foundation and set the ACC career record for interceptions with 20, a record that stood until 2012.

Carolina where he caught a 35-yard touchdown pass from Ryan Switzer. A week later, he had a 41-yard catch-and-run touchdown on a tunnel screen pass from Marquise Williams.

■ Thorpe has 15 catches for 222 yards and three touchdowns this year. He caught the game-winning touchdown pass at Virginia.

RUN GAME

■ Quarterback Marquise Williams leads the Tar Heels' running game with 726 yards. He has had led the team in rushing five times this year and has had two 100-yard rushing games.

■ Williams had a career-high 132 rushing yards against Notre Dame. Against Virginia Tech, he rushed a career-high 19 times for 94 yards in the loss. His 94 net rushing yards included minus 33 yards charged to his rushing total resulting from Virginia Tech's five sacks. Williams gained 127 yards on the ground before the sack yardage is included in his net total.

■ Williams has led the team in rushing five times this season including games against San Diego State, Virginia Tech, Notre Dame, Virginia and Pittsburgh.

■ T.J. Logan rushed for 116 yards and one touchdown on 18 carries in the win over Duke. It was the first time this year a Carolina running back has rushed for more than 100 yards. (Quarterback Marquise Williams has done it twice this year.) It was the 40th time – and 10th time in the last 11 years – a Carolina player has rushed for 100 or more yards against Duke.

■ Logan rushed 36 times for 208 yards in back-to-back games against Pitt and Duke. Prior to Pitt, Logan had a combined 17 rushes for 35 yards against Miami and Virginia and rushed for a combined 135 yards in the previous six contests.

■ Logan rushed for 92 yards on 18 carries against Pitt, including the game-winning 1-yard run with 50 seconds to play. It marked the second consecutive home game in which T.J. Logan scored the game-winning touchdown with less than one minute to play. On October 18th, Logan scored from two yards with 11 seconds to play to give UNC a 48-43 win over Georgia Tech.

■ Logan had a career-high 18 carries against both Pitt and Duke

■ Tailback Romar Morris rushed 17 times for 95 yards against Duke. His previous highs this year were nine carries twice and 46 yards against East Carolina. Morris had gained 85 yards rushing in his previous six games combined.

■ Carolina rushed 57 times for 315 yards against Duke, its highest single-game mark in both categories this year. Previous highs were 48 rushes against Liberty and 238 yards against Pitt. It is the most rushing yards since gaining 339 on the ground vs. Virginia Tech in 2012.

■ Four different Tar Heels led the team in rushing in each of the first four games this season. Reserve tailback Charles Brunson had a team-high 54 yards in the Liberty win. Williams led the team with 63 yards on the ground vs. San Diego State. Junior Romar Morris was Carolina's leading rusher with nine carries for 46 yards and two touchdowns at ECU. Freshman Elijah Hood rushed for 71 yards and scored a touchdown against Clemson.

■ Carolina is averaging 156.6 rushing yards per game this season.

O-LINE YOUTH & INJURIES

■ North Carolina's youthful offensive line has been hit by injuries to three starters this year. Landon Turner, North Carolina's most experienced offensive lineman did not play against ECU and Clemson. He returned for the Virginia Tech game. True freshman Jared Cohen made his first two career starts in Turner's place.

■ The offensive line took another hit in the loss at ECU when right tackle Jon Heck went down with an injury and did not return. He did not play against Clemson or Virginia Tech, but did return at Notre Dame.

■ Center Lucas Crowley missed the Miami game after going down with an injury against Virginia.

■ Against arguably the league's best defensive line at Clemson, Carolina started four sophomores and a true freshman on the offensive line.

■ With a healthy offensive line against Notre Dame, Georgia Tech, Pittsburgh and Duke, the Tar Heels posted 512, 579, 502 and 591 total offense yards, respectively.

WALK-ON WARRIORS

■ Carolina has received enormous contributions from several players who came to Chapel Hill without a scholarship. In the Liberty game alone, Jeff Schoettmer had a 19-yard interception return for touchdown, Dominique Green recovered three fumbles and returned one for 20 yards, Mack Hollins had a 33-yard touchdown reception, Charles Brunson was the leading rusher and had a touchdown, punter Tommy Hibbard was outstanding in changing the field position and kickoff specialist Nick Weiler had eight touchbacks on nine kicks. All of those players came to Carolina as walk-ons.

■ Carolina played 15 walk-ons or former walk-ons in the Liberty game, including three starters on defense.

■ Carolina has scored on an interception return three times and twice on a fumble return. LB Jeff Schoettmer scored on a 19-yard pick-six against Liberty and a 29-yard return at Notre Dame. Cornerback Brian Walker scored on a 100-yard interception return vs. SDSU. Cayson Collins scored on a 39-yard fumble return at Miami and Tim Scott scored on a 10-yard fumble return at Duke.

Larry Fedora's teams have shown a penchant for scoring on interception returns during his head coaching career. In 2011, his Southern Miss squad set an NCAA record with eight touchdowns on interception returns.

■ Four defensive Tar Heels - Dominique Green (2013 vs. Virginia), Tim Scott (2012 vs. Georgia Tech), Jeff Schoettmer (2014 vs. Liberty & Notre Dame) and Brian Walker (2014 vs. SDSU) have scored on interception returns in their careers.

QUICK HIT TEAM NOTES

■ Carolina is sixth in the nation in points off turnovers. The Tar Heels have scored 108 points following opponent turnovers.

■ Carolina is 13th in the country in kickoff return defense.

■ Carolina leads the ACC and ranks 19th in the country with 860 total plays. The Tar Heels rank 17th in the country, averaging 77.8 plays per game. Defensively, however, UNC is 118th nationally, allowing 78.2 plays per game.

■ The average length of a Carolina game is three hours, 32 minutes this season.

■ Five different players have thrown touchdown passes this season. They are: QB Marquise Williams (17), QB Mitch Trubisky (3), WR Ryan Switzer (1), WR Quinshad Davis (1) and P Tommy Hibbard (1). No other school in the country has as many players with touchdown passes.

■ Carolina's six touchdown drives against Pitt averaged 79.2 yards. The Tar Heels scored on touchdown drives of 72, 80, 75, 92, 81 and 75 yards. The two teams combined for 11 touchdown drives and the shortest drive by yards was a two-play, 51-yard drive by Pitt. Eight of the 11 combined TD drives went for 75 or more yards.

■ Carolina and Notre Dame combined to score 93 points in the Irish's 50-43 victory. That is the most in the history of the series. The previous high was 71 in the 45-26 Notre Dame win in 2006.

■ The 93 points in the Notre Dame game were the most combined points ever in a game in Notre Dame Stadium history (built in 1930). The previous high for Notre Dame Stadium was 92 on October 8, 2011, a 59-33 Irish win over Air Force.

■ Carolina and Notre Dame combined for 1,032 yards – 516 for Notre Dame and 516 for the Tar Heels. Carolina ran 84 plays and the Irish ran 81. This is the second time this season that both teams ran at least 80 plays in a game (East Carolina 97, UNC 82).

■ Carolina and Georgia Tech combined for 1,190 total offense yards, the most in a game in Kenan Stadium history. The previous high was 1,166 by UNC and Maryland in 1993. Georgia Tech gained 611 yards and UNC amassed 579. The 611 yards by the Yellow Jackets are the ninth-most by an opponent in any game and the second-most in a Tar Heel victory (Arizona State had 657 in 2002 in a UNC win).

■ Three different Tar Heels threw touchdown passes against East Carolina. Wide receiver Ryan Switzer threw a 35-yard scoring pass to T.J. Thorpe, punter Tommy Hibbard connected on a 29-yarder with Eric Albright on a fake field goal and quarterback Mitch Trubisky had a 10-yard touchdown

pass to Jack Tabb in the fourth quarter.

■ Against San Diego State, the Tar Heels had two plays of 90 yards or longer in one game for the first time in school history. CB Brian Walker had a 100-yard interception return for a touchdown and WR Mack Hollins caught a 91-yard pass from Marquise Williams for a score. The Williams to Hollins pass play is the longest by the Tar Heels in Kenan Stadium history.

■ This season, the Tar Heels have recovered 11 fumbles and made 12 interceptions. Carolina is ranked 22nd in the country in turnovers gained. That is quite a contrast from last season when Carolina recovered just seven fumbles and ranked 71st in turnovers gained and 48th in turnover margin. In the first game of 2014 vs. Liberty, the Tar Heels recovered four fumbles and forced six turnovers. That is the highest turnover total by a Carolina opponent since Boston College had six in 2009. Carolina added three interceptions in the win over SDSU, including two by cornerback Brian Walker and a pick in the end zone on SDSU's final drive by safety Tim Scott.

■ The Tar Heels ran 93 offensive plays in the win over Liberty. The last time UNC ran 90 or more plays in a game was in 1994 when UNC ran 96 plays against Georgia Tech. The previous high under Fedora was 86 vs. NC State in 2012. Carolina's season high in 2013 was 79 plays on four occasions.

■ A total of 67 players saw action in the win over Liberty, including eight true freshmen and six redshirt freshmen. The true freshmen were DB Allen Artis, WR Austin Proehl, LB Tyrell Tomlin, LB Cayson Collins, TB Elijah Hood, OG Jared Cohen, OT Bentley Spain and DT Tyler Powell. The redshirt freshmen were DE Dajaun Drennon, WR Jackson Boyer, QB Mitch Trubisky, OG Brad Henson, WR Jordan Fieulleateau and DT Nazair Jones.

■ Nine different players made their first career start in the season opener against Liberty – OT John Ferranto, OG Will Dancy, WR Bug Howard and WR Ryan Switzer on offense; DE Dajaun Drennon, DT Justin Thomason, B Shakeel Rashad, R Ryan Mangum and CB T.J. Jiles on defense.

■ Carolina scored 28 consecutive points in three minutes and 49 seconds against Liberty after falling behind 22-21. Carolina scored on a 33-yard touchdown pass from Marquise Williams to Mack Hollins, a 19-yard interception return by Jeff Schoettmer, a 15-yard run by Williams and a 4-yard pass from Mitch Trubisky to Jack Tabb to take a 49-22 lead.

■ It's unlikely that many other programs are getting as much out of their walk-on program as Carolina. A total of 15 walk-ons, or former walk-ons, played in the Liberty game, including three starters on defense - LB Jeff Schoettmer, R Ryan Mangum and S Dominique Green.

■ Carolina had just six scholarship seniors on its 2014 training camp roster and just one senior starter on offense – tight end Jack Tabb.

QUICK HIT PLAYER/COACH NOTES FROM A TO Z

■ Tight end **Eric Albright** is enrolled in Carolina's Master's of Accounting program at the business school. He is the only graduate student on the roster. Albright scored his first career touchdown when the Tar Heels faked a field goal in the loss at ECU. Holder Tommy Hibbard hit Albright for a 29-yard score. Albright had a 67-yard reception at Clemson.

■ Freshman linebacker **Cayson Collins** scored on a 39-yard fumble return for a touchdown in the second quarter at Miami. It was the first fumble return for a TD by a Tar Heel since defensive tackle Cam Thomas returned one 20 yards for a score at Boston College in 2009. Carolina has scored four defensive touchdowns this season – three interception returns, one fumble return. Collins made his first career start against Pitt and led the team with nine tackles.

■ Sophomore **Lucas Crowley** is the starter at center. He replaced Russell Bodine who left school early to enter the NFL Draft and is starting for Cincinnati. Crowley's only previous start prior to this season was at Pittsburgh where he faced All-America DT Aaron Donald. He registered five knock-down blocks in Carolina's win over the Panthers.

■ Redshirt freshman **Dajaun Drennon** became the first freshman to start at defensive end at UNC since Kareem Martin vs. LSU in 2010. He continues to improve and has 33 tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss and two sacks this season.

■ Head Coach **Larry Fedora** has never had a losing season in his six previous years as a head coach, including four at Southern Miss and two at UNC. He won his 50th career game vs. Liberty to open the 2014 season.

■ Defensive end **Junior Gnonkonde** moved to the United States from the Ivory Coast in Africa when he was in high school. He began playing football as a high school freshman and developed into an outstanding player. He speaks five languages, including his native French. Against Georgia Tech, he posted a career-high seven tackles (all in the first half).

■ **Dominique Green** started all 13 games last year as a true freshman and was second on the team with three interceptions, including a 62-yard touch-down return vs. Virginia. He had three fumble recoveries in the season opener vs. Liberty and returned one for 20 yards.

■ Sophomore left tackle **Jon Heck** is the son of Andy Heck who was an All-America at Notre Dame and played 12 seasons in the NFL. Jon started 16 consecutive games to open his career before an injury caused him to miss two games. He has 21 career starts.

■ Senior punter **Tommy Hibbard**, a former walk-on from Charlotte, N.C., is on track to become just the fourth punter in UNC history to lead the team in punting average for four consecutive seasons. Hibbard was a preseason All-America pick by Phil Steele.

■ Carolina has landed the top running back in the state each of the past two seasons in **T.J. Logan** of Greensboro in 2012 and **Elijah Hood** of Charlotte in 2013. Hood enrolled at UNC in January and participated in spring practice. He squatted 605 pounds in the Tar Heels' offseason strength and conditioning workouts. Hood is an Eagle Scout who earned the honor after renovating his church parking lot while in high school.

■ Sophomore wide receiver **Bug Howard** posted a 39.5-inch vertical leap during testing this offseason. Howard is third on the team with 33 receptions for 344 yards and two touchdowns.

■ Redshirt freshman **Nazair Jones** made the defensive play of the game with a fourth-quarter interception at Virginia. He rumbled 20 yards to the Virginia 38-yard line and Carolina scored the game-winning touchdown on the ensuing drive.

■ Sophomore cornerback **Des Lawrence** picked off his first pass of the season in the win over Virginia. Lawrence ranks third on the team with 63 tackles.

■ Running back/kick returner **T.J. Logan** was one of only seven players in the NCAA to return two kickoffs in 2013 for touchdowns. This season, he ranks third in the league in kickoff return average.

■ Former quarterback **Caleb Pressley** elected to end his career a year early and is now the team's sideline signal caller. Pressley takes the calls from the press box and signals them to the quarterback in an NFL jersey. He signaled the plays while wearing a Julius Peppers' Green Bay jersey against

Liberty, Sylvester Williams (Denver) vs. SDSU, Bruce Carter (Dallas) at ECU, Da'Norris Searcy (Buffalo) at Clemson, T.J. Yates (Atlanta) vs. Virginia Tech, Russell Bodine (Cincinnati) at Notre Dame, Eric Ebron (Detroit) vs. Georgia Tech, Quinton Coples (New York Jets) vs. Virginia, James Hurst (Baltimore Ravens) at Miami, Jonathan Cooper (Arizona) vs. Pitt and Kareem Martin (Arizona) vs. Duke.

■ Junior bandit **Shakeel Rashad** can claim a team-high six nicknames – "Shaktus," "Shakinabox," "Shaktastic," "Radio Shak," "Shakie Robinson," and "St. Shaktrick." Rashad has started the first two games of the season.

■ Linebacker **Jeff Schoettmer** came to Carolina as an undersized walk-on linebacker in 2011 out of Jesuit College Prep in Dallas, Texas. He has added bulk and last season ranked second on the team in tackles. Schoettmer's father, Steve, played linebacker at Duke, and his mother, Donna, played tennis at Wake Forest. Schoettmer is a friend of PGA golfer Jordan Speith, who also attended Jesuit College Prep.

■ After three years as a starting cornerback, **Tim Scott** moved to safety for his senior season. He actually played his first full game at safety in the 2013 Belk Bowl vs. Cincinnati.

■ **Scott** sealed the win over San Diego State with a lunging interception in the end zone with just 14 seconds left in the game. The interception was Scott's eighth as a Tar Heel, which ranks just two behind several players for ninth place on the UNC career list. Scott has picked off at least one pass all four seasons in Chapel Hill.

■ Former standout defensive tackle **Ryan Sims** has returned to Chapel Hill to finish his degree and serve as an undergraduate student coach. Sims was the No. 6 overall NFL draft pick (Kansas City) in 2002. Sims played on the same defensive line at UNC as Julius Peppers and helped lead the Tar Heels to a 16-10 win over Auburn in the 2001 Peach Bowl.

■ **Kendrick Singleton**, who goes by the nickname "Bull," was called the most fit player on the team by strength and conditioning coach Lou Hernandez. Singleton started six games last year at wideout and will move to the "Y" position this year, a hybrid between a true wide receiver and a tight end.

■ **Sam Smiley** has missed 15 games in the last two years due to injury, but returned to action vs. Liberty as the starter at safety.

■ Linebacker **Nathan Staub's** grandfather is Larry Morris, the Chicago Bears star who was named the MVP of the 1963 NFL championship game. Morris was dubbed the "Brahma Bull" for his bruising style of play. Staub, a sophomore from Chestnut Mountain, Ga., made his first career start last year in the Belk Bowl and had a career best six tackles.

■ CB **M.J. Stewart** made his first career interception early in the fourth quarter against Virginia Tech.

■ Sophomore **Ryan Switzer** is a fan of Christmas movies and the movie Frozen. He tied the NCAA single-season record with five punt return touchdowns in 2013 and became the first true freshman in UNC history to earn first-team All-America honors.

■ Tight end **Jack Tabb** is the only senior starter on the offensive side of the ball. Tabb played both tight end and linebacker a year ago, but will concentrate only on offense this year. This season, he has 21 catches for 206 yards and two touchdowns.

■ Quarterback **Mitch Trubisky** was the Ohio player of the year as a senior in 2012. Trubisky has played in all nine games this season and has

completed 29 of 56 attempts for 314 yards, three touchdowns and three interceptions.

■ **Trubisky** came off the bench at Virginia after Williams had his helmet ripped off on a sack and completed his only pass of the day for a 16-yard score to T.J. Thorpe. That gave UNC a 28-27 lead with 4:05 to play in the fourth quarter.

■ Sophomore cornerback **Brian Walker** was named Athlon's National Defensive Player of the Week after his performance in the Tar Heels' 31-27 win over San Diego State. The Charlotte, N.C., native picked off two passes and had 126 interception return yards, including a 100-yard return for a touchdown. He became just the third player in UNC history to return an interception 100 yards for a touchdown, joining Bob Gantt vs. William & Mary in 1950 and Reggie Love vs. Tulane in 1994. He became the 94th player in NCAA history to return an interception 100 yards since records were first kept in 1941. Walker finished with five tackles and assisted on a tackle for loss.

■ Against ECU, **Walker** picked off a pass in the first half and returned it 23 yards to set up Carolina's first touchdown. He also recovered a blocked field goal and returned it 30 yards.

■ In addition to the Athlon's National Defensive Player of the Week honor, **Walker** was named the Jim Thorpe National Defensive Back of the Week and the Co-Defensive Back of the Week by the ACC following the SDSU game. The Thorpe Award is presented at the end of the season to the nation's top defensive back.

■ Walk-on place-kicker **Nick Weiler** won the kickoff duties last year and is off to an outstanding start this year. Forty-one of his 70 kickoffs have gone for touchbacks. He had 19 total touchbacks last year.

■ Quarterback **Marquise Williams** attended George Whitfield's spring break quarterback camp (California) earlier this year. He also served as a counselor at the Manning Passing Academy (Louisiana) just a few weeks before training camp began.

SHORT ON SENIORS

■ At the start of training camp, North Carolina had just six scholarship seniors on the roster in 2014. "It's by far the youngest team I've ever coached," says head coach Larry Fedora. Carolina has just one senior starter on offense – TE Jack Tabb – and four on defense – LB Travis Hughes, LB Jeff Schoettmer, DT Ethan Farmer and S Tim Scott. Senior defensive tackle Devonte Brown is a reserve defensive tackle.

■ Carolina's opening day training camp roster of 105 players included a staggering 67 underclassmen (63.8 percent). Only Pittsburgh, NC State and Wake Forest have more underclassmen in the ACC and just 18 schools in the country have more. Carolina's training camp roster was comprised of 40 freshmen and 27 sophomores, 28 juniors and 10 seniors.

■ Following training camp, Fedora awarded scholarships to punter Tommy Hibbard, deep snapper Alex Marrs and place-kicker Thomas Moore to bring the total to nine scholarship seniors for 2014.

NOTING THE OFFENSE

■ Carolina has averaged more than 425 yards per game in each of Larry Fedora's three seasons in Chapel Hill. Last year was just the ninth time in school history Carolina had averaged more than 400 yards per game. The last time Carolina posted back-to-back seasons with 400 yards per game was the 1993 and 1994 seasons. Only once in school history – from 1981-83 – has Carolina put together three straight seasons with 400 yards or more per game. In Fedora's first season in 2012, Carolina set the school record with 485.6 yards per game. This year, Carolina is averaging 445.2 yards per game.

■ Carolina has posted more than 500 yards of total offense 10 times in 36 games under Larry Fedora, including a school-record 721 yards vs. ODU in 2013. UNC has gained at least 400 yards in 26 of Fedora's 36 games as head coach.

■ Since 2012, Carolina is averaging 42.6 points per game at Kenan Stadium (19 games) and 28.4 points per game away from home (16 games).

- Since 2011, North Carolina has had 10 players selected in the top two rounds of the NFL Draft, trailing only Alabama (16) and LSU (11) in that time frame.

- Five Tar Heels were picked in the 2014 NFL Draft – Eric Ebron (1st round, Detroit), Kareem Martin (3rd round, Arizona), Russell Bodine (4th round, Cincinnati), Tre Boston (4th round, Carolina) and Jabari Price (7th round, Minnesota). In addition, quarterback Bryn Renner (Denver), offensive tackle James Hurst (Baltimore), tailback A.J. Blue (Washington) and defensive tackle Tim Jackson (Houston) signed free agent deals.

- Carolina's five 2014 NFL Draftees ranked second in the ACC and tied for seventh nationally. Only LSU (9), Alabama (8), Notre Dame (8), FSU (7), Stanford (6) and Ohio State (6) had more.

- Tight end Eric Ebron became the 23rd overall first round NFL Draft pick in school history, and the seventh since 2008, when he was chosen 10th overall by the Detroit Lions.

- In Larry Fedora's two seasons at UNC, the Tar Heels have produced three first round picks – offensive guard Jonathan Cooper (seventh overall to Arizona in 2013), Sylvester Williams (28th overall to Denver in 2013) and Eric Ebron (10th overall to Detroit in 2014).

- North Carolina has produced seven first-round draft picks since 2008. That is the most of any ACC school. Florida State ranks second with six. The only other in-state schools with a first-round draft pick since 2008 are Wake Forest (1) and ECU (1).

- Carolina has had 23 all-time first-round draft picks, which ranks just outside the top 25 in the country. It is, however, the most of any school in the state, ahead of NC State (15), Duke (5) and Wake Forest (4).

- Ebron was the first tight end taken in the 2014 NFL Draft. UNC head coach Larry Fedora also coached the first tight end taken in the 2009 draft when the Lions picked Oklahoma State's Brandon Pettigrew.

- Kareem Martin became the fourth Carolina defensive end taken in the last five years when he was selected by Arizona in 2014. Other recent UNC defensive ends selected include Quinton Coples in the first round of the 2012 draft, E.J. Wilson in the fourth round of the 2010 draft and Robert Quinn in the first round of the 2011 draft.

- Carolina has had seven defensive linemen picked in the last five NFL Drafts.

- In the first round of the 2013 NFL Draft, North Carolina offensive guard Jonathan Cooper was selected seventh overall by the Arizona Cardinals and defensive tackle Sylvester Williams was picked 28th overall by the Denver Broncos.

- Cooper became the first offensive guard selected in the top 10 of the NFL Draft since 1997 when Colorado's Chris Naeole was selected by the New Orleans Saints at No. 10. He became the highest selected offensive guard since Bill Fralic was taken No. 2 by Atlanta in 1985.

- In 2013, Giovani Bernard became the first running back taken in the NFL Draft when he was selected by the Cincinnati Bengals with the fifth pick of the second round (37th overall). It was the first time Carolina had produced the first tailback of the draft. Ethan Horton, a running back at UNC, was selected in the first round of the 1985 draft, but played exclusively tight end in the NFL.

- A total of 30 Carolina players have been selected in the NFL Draft since 2008, which ranks second among ACC schools. Two Tar Heels were picked in the 2008 draft, five in 2009, two in 2010, a league-high nine in 2011, two in 2012, five in 2013 and five in 2014.

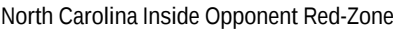
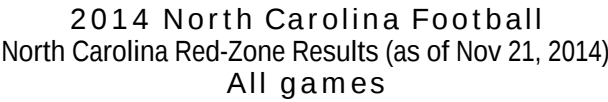
