OFFENSE

North Carolina led the ACC last year in batting average (.300) and hits (476) and will look to do so again this season with three of the Tar Heels' top four batters returning. Sophomore Kristen Brown is looking to repeat another stellar season after posting 11 home runs and 39 runs in her rookie campaign. Junior Amber Parrish will also contribute to the lineup after hitting .329 last season, while sophomore Aquilla Mateen will look to do damage on the bases after recording a .346 batting average and stealing 18 bases. The Tar Heels also return some key pinch hitters from last year, including Kati Causey and Lauren Walker, and have added some offensive punch on both sides of the plate with the addition of the freshmen class.

PITCHING AND CATCHING

Lori Spingola returns for her senior year as Carolina's ace and will lead one of the Tar Heels' strongest pitching lineups in program history. UNC ranked fourth in 2013 in earned run average in the ACC at 3.11 and third in opposing batting average at .243. Spingola received All-ACC honors as a junior and recorded an ACC-best 303 strikeouts. That mark was the 11th most by a pitcher last year in the NCAA, and was second in the ACC and 12th in the NCAA with 30 wins while taking over the top spot in Carolina single season history with 283.1 innings pitched. Supporting Spingola is a loaded bullpen, including fellow senior Ashley Bone who started eight games last year in the circle and finished 6-4 with a 4.03 ERA. Senior Sara Buchholz and sophomore Lauren Fuller, coming off a freshman season hampered by injury, will return as experienced pitchers. Freshmen Lauren Batten and Kendra Lynch will also make a significant impact, giving the Tar Heels a variety of looks in the circle. Junior Amber Parrish, who had 330 putouts last year, will bring experience to a very versatile catching staff. The catching staff depth is further strengthened and deeper with the addition of freshmen Jillian Ferraro and the return of both junior Kati Causey and sophomore Elly Wagner.

DEFENSE

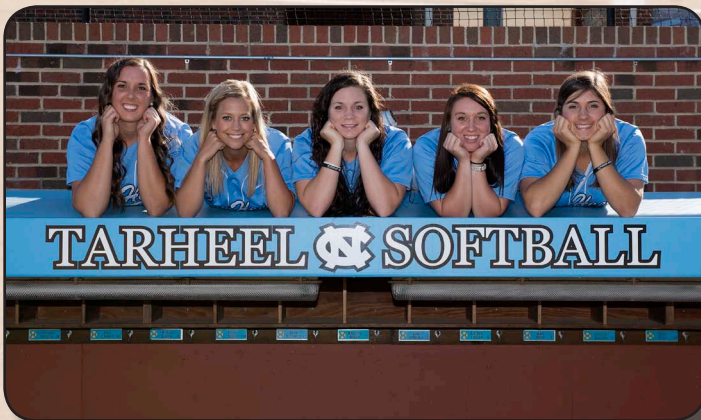
The Tar Heels return six defensive starters and will work to lead the ACC in fielding percentage again after leading last year at .976. Third base will be up for grabs between sophomore Tracy Chandless, junior Stephanie Krider and freshman Darby Rosen. Second base will also be a contested spot between Elena Covert and Erin Satterfield, and Lauren Walker will provide depth at first base. Senior Amy Nece and sophomore Aquilla Mateen are back to anchor the outfield in addition to redshirt junior Jordan Scarboro, who returns from an injury. Sophomore Elly Wagner will be a factor in the outfield as well. The infield returns junior Amber Parrish at catcher, redshirt junior Jenna Kelly at first base, sophomore second baseman sophomore Erin Satterfield, and sophomore Kristen Brown at shortstop.

Donna J. Papa





Donna J. Papa, the NFCA Hall of Fame head softball coach at North Carolina since 1986, has helped build Carolina softball into one of the top programs in the country. Papa's Tar Heels continue to show improvement each season. Papa has led Carolina to the NCAA Tournament in 11 of the last 13 years and guided the Tar Heels to a school record for wins as Carolina went 50-12-1 in 2008 - hosting the first ever NCAA Regional at Anderson Stadium. UNC has had 15 consecutive winning seasons, with 11 of those including 40 or more wins during the campaign.

Under her tutelage, Carolina has established itself as a perennial top-25 program, testimony that North Carolina competes at the highest levels on the field while excelling academically at one of the nation's top universities. On Nov. 30, 2012, Coach Papa was inducted into the National Fastpitch Coaches Association Hall of Fame. She was joined by former Palomar head coach Mark Eldridge and Oklahoma head coach Patty Gasso, and the trio was inducted at the 2012 NFCA Convention in Orlando, Fla.

Papa won her 1,000th career game during the 2011 season and did so in grand fashion as the Tar Heels blanked Florida State 4-0 on March 27. The milestone victory for Papa also marked the Tar Heels' first ever sweep of the Seminoles. Only 11 NCAA Division I coaches have ever achieved 1,000 victories.

One of the 20 winningest coaches in NCAA history, Papa joined the 900-win club Feb. 20, 2009, in a victory over Cal State-Fullerton. In her remarkable 30-year coaching career, she has compiled a 1,094-590-5 record, including a 1,066-575-5 mark in 28 years as head coach at Carolina.

Carolina claimed the 2001 Atlantic Coast Conference Championship, five regular season titles and has played in the title game on three other occasions. Papa has been named ACC Coach of the Year five times - in 1996, 1998, 2000, 2008 and 2012. Since coming to Chapel Hill in 1985, Papa has coached players to All-America seasons on 11 occasions and 56 players to All-Southeast Region honors.

Theresa Buscemi was the first Tar Heel to earn All-America honors when she was named to the third team in 1992. Christine Kubin earned first-team honors in 1996, and Brandy Arthur followed in 1998. Kelly Ramsey was named to the third team in 2000, Tiffany Tolleson was named a second team member in 2002 and third team in 2003, and Jaclyn Holden became the first Tar Heel freshman to earn the honor when she was named to the third team in 2003. In 2006, Crystal Cox was selected to the third team. Pitcher Danielle Spaulding was a three-time All-America after earning a first-team nod in 2010.

In addition to success on the field, Papa's program is known for excellence in the classroom. Christine Kubin earned Academic All-America honors in 1995 and '96, and nine other Tar Heels have been named to the Academic All-America All-District team. Players who have earned that honor are Jenny Reed (1989), Julie O'Shields (1992), Lynnae Flynn (1993), Kubin (1994), Colleen Lefferts (1999), Beth Olen (2000), Sarah Young (2001, '02), Anna Tharrington (2003), Jessica Graziano (2004) and Anna Evans (2006, '07). In 2010, Stephanie Murad and senior Brittany Robinson were named NFCA Scholar Athletes, while senior Kelli Wheeler was named an NFCA Scholar Athlete in 2011 and 2012, and freshman Lauren Fuller received the honor in 2013.

Tar Heel softball players regularly earn spots on the ACC Academic Honor Roll. Most recently, Jenna Kelly, Erin Satterfield and Lori Spingola earned ACC All-Academic nods, while in 2012, Kelli Wheeler was tabbed the ACC Softball Scholar-Athlete of the Year, earning her third ACC academic honor. UNC has a league-high six selections in 2012, as Christine Knauer, Stephanie Murad, Anna Roberts, Brittany Robinson, Brittany McKinney and Wheeler were honored. Other recent academic nods went to Sara Buchholz, Breanna Brown and Emily Troup.

During her time at North Carolina, Papa has been a driving force behind the construction of the Anderson Softball Stadium. The Tar Heels began play at Anderson Stadium and Williams Field in 2002. The second phase of construction featured the additions of the team building, concessions, press box, restrooms and locker rooms, and was completed and dedicated in 2006. It features many player-friendly innovations while allowing the fans to watch and players to play softball in a first class facility.

Prior to arriving in Chapel Hill, Papa spent two seasons as head volleyball and softball coach at Susquehanna University. Her 1985 softball squad compiled a 16-8 record, won its conference division and qualified for the Middle Atlantic Conference Championship. Papa's duties at Susquehanna also included working as the women's intramural coordinator, a physical education instructor and the school's primary recruiter for women's athletics. She served as an assistant softball coach at St. John's University from 1981-83 after spending one year as an assistant coach at UNC Greensboro while she worked toward a master's degree in physical education. Papa earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from the University of Connecticut in 1979. She played four seasons of softball for the Huskies and was co-captain her junior and senior seasons. Papa's playing career also encompassed stints with ASA Major Fast Pitch teams including the Franklin Coronets (West Haven, Conn.) and the Waterford (Conn.) Mariners.

A respected clinician, Papa conducts Carolina softball camps and clinics throughout the year. She is currently serving a two-year term on the National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-America Committee. She also served on the NCAA All-Region Committee and completed a two-year term representing the ACC on the NFCA Top-25 Selection Committee in 2006 and 2007. Championship Productions produced a video titled "All Access North Carolina Softball Practices with Donna Papa," which is a tribute to her excellent coaching technique and widespread respect in the softball coaching community. Moreover, the NFCA recently invited Coach Papa to write a chapter on "Establishing a Positive Player-Coach Relationship" for the "Softball Coaching Bible II."

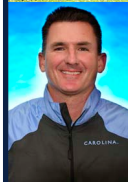

Tony Baldwin is in his second year with Carolina softball after joining the Tar Heels in 2012. Baldwin came to UNC after spending two years at the University of Georgia, where he served as the volunteer assistant coach.

Baldwin's primary responsibilities at UNC include developing the team's hitters and infielders. In his first season with the Tar Heels, Baldwin helped nine hitters finish the season batting over .300 while six had slugging percentages over .500. Constance Orr ranked third in the ACC with a .356 batting average and her 62 hits ranked fifth, while Kristen Brown's .341 batting average ranked ninth in the conference and her 60 hits were sixth.

Prior to coaching at Georgia, Baldwin was an assistant coach for the Michigan State baseball team from 2005-08, serving as the interim head coach during the team's coaching transition. At Michigan State, Baldwin served as the recruiting coordinator, and was the infielders' coach, assistant hitting coach and third base coach during his stint there as well.

Baldwin's first recruiting class at Michigan State matriculated a freshman All-American, a 30th-round draft pick and a 46th-round draft pick. His second recruiting class was ranked the top recruiting class in the Big Ten and was ranked top-50 in the country by Baseball America. His third recruiting class also produced a freshman All-American and became the class with the most wins in school history.

Baldwin was the assistant head baseball coach from 2003-05 after serving as the assistant coach from 1999-2003 at Dartmouth College, where he was the recruiting coordinator, travel manager, eligibility coordinator and worked with fundraising and alumni relations. At Dartmouth he was the hitting and fielders coach, coordinated team defense, and was the third base coach, helping the team to Dartmouth's first Red Rolfe Division Titles in 2000, 2001 and 2004.

He also was the assistant coach at Butler University from 1994-99, and was the head coach of the Decatur Blues, of the Central Illinois Collegiate League, in 1999. At

Butler, Baldwin was the hitting coach, infielders' and catchers' coach, and coordinated team defense. He helped lead the team to three MCC titles (1996, 1998 and 1999), which were the first in the history of the program.

In addition to coaching, Baldwin served as the operations director at Camp Weequahic from 2009-2012.

Baldwin and his wife Suzanne have four children, Ella, Abby, Brady and Katie.

Head coach Donna J. Papa announced on Sept. 3, 2013, that Marissa Young, a three-time All-American pitcher at the University of Michigan, was named an assistant coach for the Carolina softball team.

Young, who was named the 2002 Big Ten Pitcher of the Year and 2003 Big Ten Player of the Year, will primarily coach pitchers and catchers for the Tar Heels.

"I'm excited to welcome Marissa Young to the Carolina softball staff," Papa said. "She is a great fit for our program. Marissa had a stellar career as a pitcher and all around player at Michigan, one of the top softball programs in the country, year in and year out.

"Marissa has gained experience as a head coach at a small university and as an assistant at a Division I program. All of those experiences have prepared her to be in charge of developing our pitchers and catchers as well as many other areas of our program."

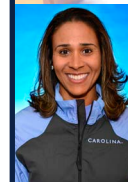
Young spent the last two seasons as an assistant at Eastern Michigan, where she served as the compliance liaison, recruiting coordinator and managed team travel and the operational budget, among other duties. She helped coach five Academic All-Americans and five players of the week during her time at Eastern Michigan.

"Coaching under Donna Papa, such a class act and quality person with her years of experience and success, is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity that I am so blessed to have," Young said. "I could not be more excited to take over the pitchers and catchers for such a great program here at UNC. The bullpen is stacked with talent, and I am looking forward to helping them achieve their goals this season."

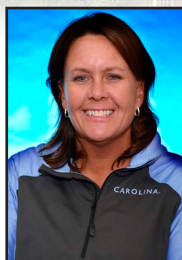
Prior to her stint at EMU, Young was the head coach at Concordia University (Ann Arbor, Mich.) from 2008-11. In less than three years with the program, she turned the 2-20 program to a 23-23 record, the second-most wins in a single season since an appearance in the 2002 NAIA National Tournament.

Young graduated from Michigan in 2003 as the all-time strikeout leader (927), and her 88 career wins became the second highest in program history. She also matched the then-program's single-season home run record with 13 in 2003. Young also played two years of professional softball, one overseas in Italy and the second year with the Texas Thunder of the NPF.

A native of Santa Ana, Calif., Young has three children: Layla, Jolyna and Kayden.

Tadlock is a graduate of UNC Greensboro (1990), where she played softball for the Spartans. She received her teaching certificate in 1999 from East Carolina University.



Bubba Cunningham
Director of Athletics

Lawrence R. (Bubba) Cunningham is in his second full year and third year overall as Carolina's director of athletics. One of Cunningham's first accomplishments at UNC was the development of a strategic plan that adopted the mission statement – "We Educate and Inspire Through Athletics" – and identified Responsibility, Innovation, Service and Excellence (RISE) as the department's core values.

Last year, Carolina finished eighth in the NACDA Director's Cup on the strength of national championships in women's soccer and women's lacrosse. The Tar Heels also had Top 10 finishes in five sports. The women's tennis team captured the ITA national indoor title and six other programs finished in the Top 25. Larry Fedora, one of two UNC head coaches hired by Cunningham, led the football team to share of first place in the Coastal Division.

UNC's women's program captured the 2013 Capital One Cup, which is awarded to the nation's best Division I athletics program. A record 329 Tar Heel student-athletes made the ACC Honor Roll, which requires a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0.

Cunningham is in his 11th year as a DI director of athletics, including six years at Tulsa and three years at Ball State. From 1988-2002, Cunningham worked at his alma mater, the University of Notre Dame.

Cunningham and his wife, Tina, have four children: Matthew, Michael, John and Sarah.

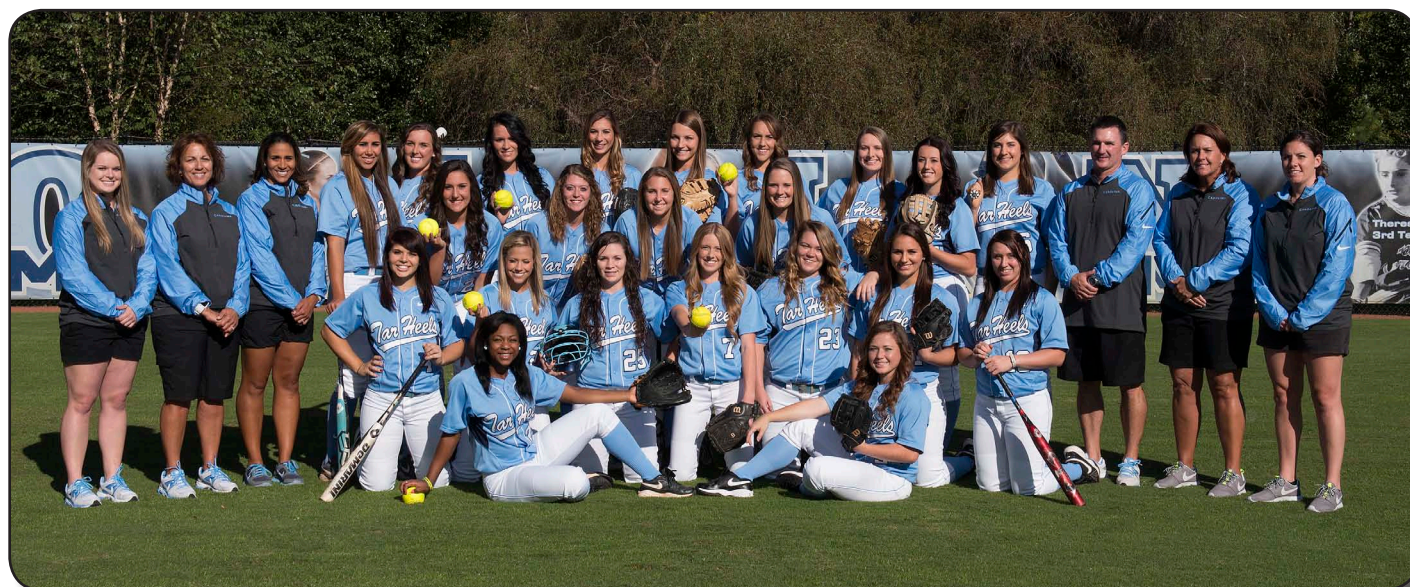

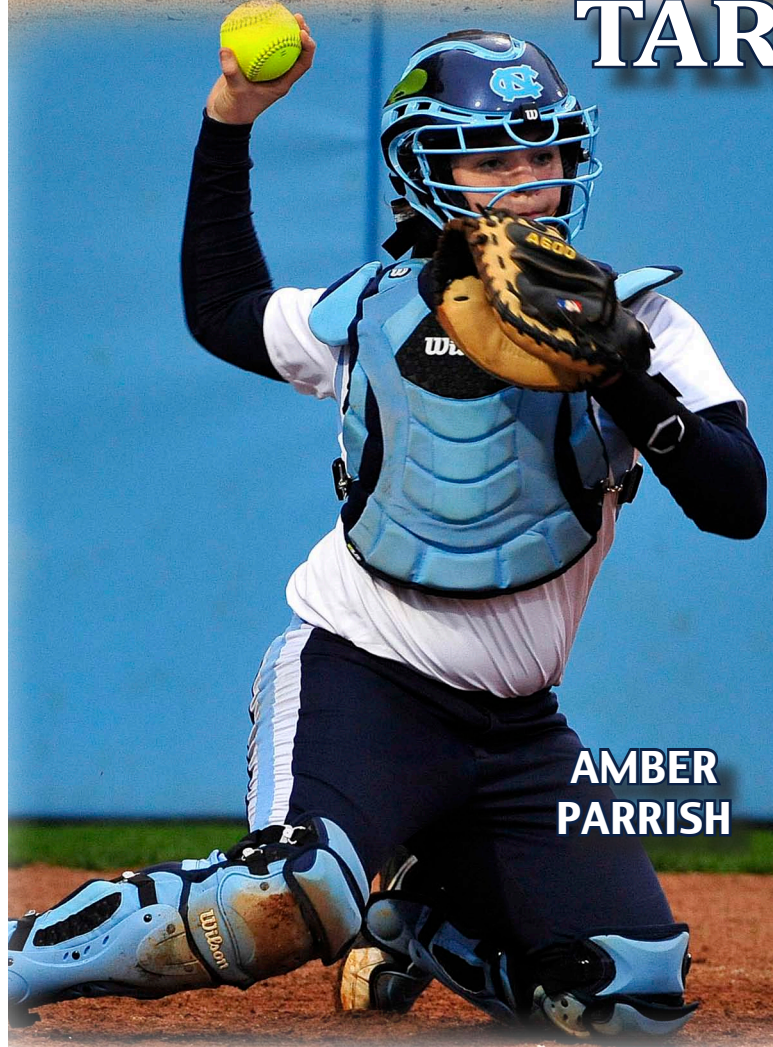

2013 SEASON IN REVIEW

North Carolina finished the 2013 season with a 40-21 overall record, the sixth time in seven years that the Tar Heels reached 40 wins in a season. Carolina finished 13-8 in ACC play and advanced to the ACC semifinals after beating Georgia Tech 6-2 in the first round. The Tar Heels also earned their 11th trip to the NCAA Tournament for their 10th appearance in the last 11 years.

TAR HEELS NAMED ALL-ACC

Four Tar Heels were named All-ACC Second Team following the 2013 campaign. Lori Spingola earned All-ACC honors for the third time in her career after striking out an ACC-best 303 batters. Spingola also finished with a 30-15 record, second in the ACC, and received ACC Pitcher of the Week three times throughout the season.

Kristen Brown, Constance Orr and Amber Parrish were also recognized for their outstanding performances last year. Brown was named ACC Player of the Week once and ended the year batting .341. Orr and Parrish also had strong seasons at the plate, finishing at .356 and .329, respectively.

NATIONAL PERFORMERS

UNC returned to the NCAA tournament for the 10th time in 11 years, playing three games in the Eugene Regional. The Tar Heels edged out No. 25 Wisconsin 3-2 in extra innings in their first game but were shutout by No. 3 Oregon 3-0 in the second game. The Tar Heels faced Wisconsin again in their final game and fell to the Badgers 6-2.

ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS

In addition to succeeding on the field, Carolina also had one of its strongest academic years in 2012-13. Jenna Kelly, Erin Satterfield, and Lori Spingola received All-ACC Academic honors, and 13 Tar Heels were named to the ACC Academic Honor Roll: Ashley Bone, Sara Buchholz, Elena Covert, Elisha Elliott, Lauren Fuller, Jenna Kelly, Erin Satterfield, Jordan Scarboro, Lori Spingola, Stephanie Krider, Megan Morrison, Lauren Walker, and Paige Williams.

Additionally, nine players made the UNC Dean's List: Ashley Bone, Elena Covert, Lauren Fuller, Erin Satterfield, Jordan Scarboro, Lori Spingola, Elly Wagner, Lauren Walker, and Paige Williams, and sophomore Elly Wagner earned a perfect 4.0 GPA in the spring last year.

Lauren Fuller earned National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-America Scholar-Athlete honors last season as well.

Fittingly, North Carolina's varsity softball program began victoriously – with a 15-6 win over N.C. Central on March 23, 1977. UNC had offered softball as a club sport until forming a varsity team for the first time that year. Though the Tar Heels finished the season with a record of 13-18 – one of only three times in school history that Carolina has posted a final season record below .500 – the future shined brightly.

Progress was swift, and by 1981 the team was competing for a national championship. The Tar Heels won the AIAW Southern Region II Tournament that year and finished second to Florida State at the AIAW National Slow-Pitch Tournament, which was held in Raleigh.

UNC switched to fast-pitch play in 1984 and compiled a 26-14 record that year, despite the fact that the roster included only six players who had previous fastpitch experience. One of those six was freshman pitcher Virginia Augusta, who threw two no-hitters in 1984, setting the standard for a career that would include numerous program records. As a senior, she led the team with a 20-5-1 record and an ERA of 0.54. She still holds several UNC records, including career winning percentage (.747) and fewest runs allowed (75).

1984 was also the year the Tar Heels, under coach Susan Clark, moved to Finley Field, which served as their home until 2002. In its early years as a program, the team played most of its home games at James Field, located on the southern part of the campus near where the Dean E. Smith Center now stands.

In 1986, Donna Papa, formerly the softball and volleyball coach at Susquehanna University, took over as coach of the Tar Heels and Carolina has never looked back. She has guided the team to 14 straight winning seasons in Chapel Hill. She enters her 29th UNC campaign with a record of 1,066-575-5 at Carolina and 1,094-590-5 overall in her 30-year coaching career.

Although the Tar Heels had been regularly playing some Atlantic Coast Conference teams, UNC did not officially begin league play until 1992, when they joined along with Florida State, Georgia Tech and Virginia. (Maryland, NC State, Boston College and Virginia Tech have since joined the ACC ranks.) It did not take Carolina long to start earning conference honors. In 1994, the Tar Heels fielded their first ACC Player of the Year when Beverly Smith batted .346 and led UNC with 36 RBIs to earn the award. Brandy Arthur followed her in 1998, and Michelle Semmes won as a junior in 2000 as did junior Danielle Spaulding in 2008.

For her outstanding work, Papa has been named conference Coach of the Year five times, most recently in 2012. The 2000 team wrapped up the season with a 47-17 mark and set team records for hits, runs, RBIs,

doubles, home runs and total bases.

The 2001 Tar Heels achieved two milestones that had been long-time program goals. On May 13, 2001, UNC won its first ACC Tournament, defeating Florida State 4-1 in the title game to claim the conference championship. Later that day, UNC received an at-large bid to the NCAA

Tournament. In their first ever tournament appearance, the Tar Heels finished 1-2 in the NCAA Regional at Norman, Okla.

The following season, Carolina softball celebrated another landmark in the program's history when the team moved into its brand-new facility - Anderson Stadium. After many years of planning, the team now competes at one of the nation's finest facilities.

In 2003, Carolina again earned an NCAA Regional bid and traveled to Fresno, Calif., where the Tar Heels went 1-2. For the first time in program history, UNC had two players earn All-America honors, with Tiffany Tolleson and freshman Jaclyn Holden both named to the third team.

The 2004 squad also made the NCAA field, traveling to Waco, Texas, where the team played several unforgettable games. In the opener, the Tar Heels went 15 scoreless innings with third-seeded Baylor, the host team, before the Bears scored a run in the 16th inning for a 1-0 win. After a 4-0 win over Texas-San Antonio, the Tar Heels met Seton Hall in what would become another epic contest. The game went to the 12th inning before UNC finally yielded a run to once again fall 1-0.

The Tar Heels earned another at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament in 2005, advancing to the NCAA Regional final in Ann Arbor, Mich., for the first time in program history. UNC finished 2-2 in the tournament, falling to eventual national champion Michigan.

From 2006 to 2009, Carolina softball compiled 191 wins led by the stellar 2009 senior class of Whitney Allen, Breanna Brown, Alyssa Francona, Lisa Norris and Emily Troup.

Carolina won a school-record 48 games in 2006, only to see that mark broken two years later when the Tar Heels reeled off 50 victories.

UNC set a new record in 2007, rattling off 28 consecutive wins en route to their fifth consecutive NCAA Tournament appearance. The Tar Heels have been eliminated by the eventual national runner-up twice, Tennessee in 2007 and Georgia in 2009.

Overall, UNC has advanced to the NCAA Regionals in 10 of the last 11 seasons and hosted regionals twice. Danielle Spaulding, one of the top players in Tar Heel history, earned second-team All-America honors in 2008, third-team in 2009 and first-team in 2010, becoming just the third player in school history to earn three All-America nods.

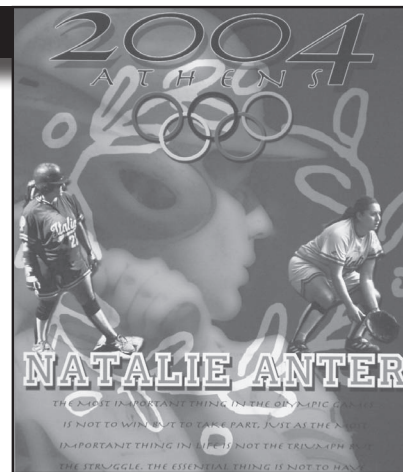


ANTER IN ATHENS OLYMPICS

Natalie Anter is not only the first Tar Heel to play on softball's biggest stage, the Olympics, but she also had a critical role in ensuring that she got that chance.

A dual citizen of the U.S. and Italy, Anter hit a three-run home run for the Italian National Team in the final game of the Africa/Europe Olympic Qualifier to lead Italy to a 9-2 win over the Czech Republic. That gave Anter and Italy a spot in the eight-team Olympic field for the 2004 Athens Games – and gave Carolina its first softball Olympian.

A four-year starter at catcher for the Tar Heels from 1999-2002, Anter earned All-Southeast Region and All-ACC honors in each year of her career. She still holds UNC career records for RBIs (164) and total bases (389), and was named to the ACC 50th Anniversary Team as one of the top 50 players in conference history.

PAPA INDUCTED INTO NFCA HALL OF FAME

Head coach Donna Papa was inducted into the 2012 NFCA Hall of Fame on Nov. 30, 2012. Papa, along with former Palomar Junior College head coach Mark Eldridge and Oklahoma head coach Patty Gasso joined one of softball's most elite fraternities with their induction.

The trio's induction rewarded each of them for legendary careers shaping and molding student-athletes into successful people. With each inductee having surpassed the prestigious 1,000-victory plateau, the group has combined to win over 3,100 games, and has totaled 42 regular season or league tournament championships and 81 All-American honorees.

With over 1,000 career victories at North Carolina, Papa has created a winning culture in Chapel Hill that is rivaled by few. Under her tutelage, since joining the program as its head coach prior to the 1986 campaign, the Tar Heels have had 24 winning seasons, including the last 14 in a row, and have been to the NCAA tournament in 10 of the past 12 years.

With Papa at the helm, Carolina has won five regular-season ACC titles and one conference tournament crown while becoming a perennial top -25 program. She has also helped numerous players achieve individual success including 11 All-Americans and 59 All-Region honorees. No stranger to accolades herself, Papa was named as the ACC Coach of the Year in 1996, 1998, 2000, 2008 and 2012.

WHY TAR HEELS?

University of North Carolina athletic teams are known as the Tar Heels because North Carolina is "The Tar Heel State."

One legend has the nickname being applied to the state's residents as long ago as the Revolutionary War. According to this story, the troops of British General Cornwallis were fording what is now known as the Tar River between Rocky Mount and Battleboro when they discovered that tar had been dumped into the stream to impede their crossing. When they finally got across the river they found their feet completely black with tar. Their observation that anyone who waded North Carolina rivers would acquire tar heels led to the nickname first being used.

Others say the nickname was acquired during the Civil War. During one of that war's fiercest battles a column supporting North Carolina troops was driven from the field. After the battle, the North Carolinians who had successfully fought it out alone, happened to meet the regiment which had fled to safety and were greeted with the question, "Any more tar down in the Old North State, boys?"

"No, not a bit," shot back one of the North Carolina soldiers. "Old Jeff's bought it all up," he went on, referring to Jefferson Davis, President of the Confederacy.

"Is that so? What's he going to do with it?"
"He's going to put it on you'ns heels to make you stick better in the next fight."

Upon hearing of the incident, Robert E. Lee smiled and said to a fellow officer, "God bless the Tar Heel boys."

A letter found in 1991 by State Archivist David Olson lends credence to another more direct theory. A letter from Maj. Joseph Engelhard describes a fight involving men from North Carolina in which Lee was heard to have said,

"There they stand as if they have tar on their heels."

The letter, dated Aug. 24, 1864, told the tale of a battle on the outskirts of Petersburg, Va. Engelhard was elected secretary of state for North Carolina in 1876.

RAM MASCOT

Since Carolina's nickname is Tar Heels, it might seem strange to have a ram as a mascot. It is. But, there is a good explanation. It's offered by Vic Huggins, Carolina's head cheerleader back in 1924.



"In 1924 school spirit was at a peak," Huggins once explained. "But something seemed to be missing. One day it hit me. Georgia had a bulldog for a mascot and State a wolf. What Carolina needed was a symbol."

Two years earlier the Tar Heels had posted a brilliant 9-1 record. The star of that 1922 team was a bruising fullback named Jack Merritt. Merritt was nicknamed "the battering ram" for the way he plunged into lines. It seemed natural to Huggins to link a mascot with Merritt's nickname.

"Charlie Woollen, the athletic business manager

at that time, agreed with the idea and gave us \$25 to purchase a fitting mascot," said Huggins.

Rameses the First was shipped in from Texas, arriving just in time to be introduced at a pep rally before the VMI game. Complete with a monogram blanket on his back, Rameses helped make the pep rally one of the school's greatest.

Then the ram was taken to Emerson Field where Carolina was an underdog to a strong VMI team. But, for three quarters the Tar Heels battled the visitors to a scoreless tie.

Late in the fourth period Carolina's Bunn Hackney was called upon to attempt a field goal. Before taking the field he rubbed Rameses' head for good luck.

Seconds later Hackney's 30-yard dropkick sailed between the goalposts, giving the Tar Heels a 3-0 victory and a legendary mascot.

SCHOOL COLORS

The adoption of light blue and white as UNC's colors dates back to the 19th Century. When the University reopened following the Civil War, most social activities were directed by two literary societies, the Dialectic and Philanthropic. The official color of the Di was light blue and that of the Phi white.

On public occasions the student officers, marshals and ball managers were chosen equally from the membership of the two societies. It had long been the custom of each society for its members to wear its color on such occasions. However, the chief marshal and chief ball manager, one from the Di and the other from the Phi, wore combination light blue and white regalias and rosettes signifying that they represented the whole student body.

So it seemed only natural for the fans to adorn themselves with the same combination as that used by the chief marshals and ball managers, colors that represented not membership in a society, but a University student body.

CAROLINA SOFTBALL ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: NATALIE ANTER



Natalie Anter Lindley, the first Tar Heel to play in the Olympics, was a four-year starting catcher for UNC. She earned All-Southeast Region and All-ACC honors all four years and holds the top spot for Carolina career RBIs and total bases. A communications major and history minor at UNC, Anter now works as a Lead Executive Sales Representative for Merck. Natalie and her husband, Brett, have a son, Thomas Daniel, born this past summer.

"I still remember my first day on campus. Coming from California, the atmosphere and culture was like nothing I had ever seen. I remember being nervous I would not fit in, but we had our team welcome lunch in the amphitheater and it was then I felt like I was home. Playing softball was all I knew, and meeting my teammates and coaches for the first time was so comforting. They became my family not just for the rest of my time there, but for the rest of my life.

Carolina softball was my life for four years, and as I look back, it was truly the most integral part of my growing up. I learned how to be away from home, how to be a teammate on and off the field, and how to have a work-life balance. There are so many things, like balancing different personalities, time management, work ethic, and self-awareness, that I now apply in my daily activities as a mom and at work.

I can't believe how time has flown and how long it has been since I was a student-athlete. The memories are still very fresh in my mind and still remain some of the best in my life. If I could offer any advice to the players now it would be to take advantage of this time. To practice hard and work on your skills, love your teammates, and cherish what will be wonderful lifelong memories you will carry with you the rest of your life." - Natalie Anter Lindley, UNC Class of 2002

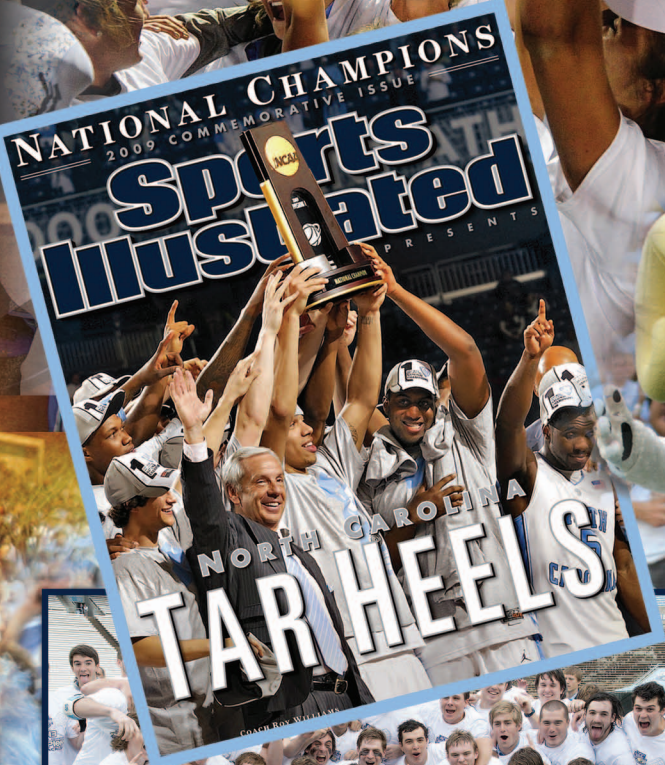

- The Academic Support Program for Student-Athletes assists Tar Heel student-athletes in exploring their interests and abilities, enjoying a broad educational experience, and reaching or exceeding their academic goals.

- The Academic Support Program is housed in the Loudermilk Center for Excellence, a 150,000-square-foot facility that serves all of Carolina's nearly 800 student-athletes across 28 varsity sports. The Loudermilk Center's largest feature is the John W. Pope Student-Athlete Academic Support Center. This facility provides classrooms for teaching and tutoring, study lounges, office space and a computer lab. It also houses the Baddour Carolina Leadership Academy, which offers leadership training for Carolina student-athletes, coaches and staff.

- The Academic Support Program helps freshmen transition from high school to college through a variety of academic programs such as academic counseling, individual tutoring, group review sessions and supplemental instruction.

- During the 2012-13 academic year, a record 329 Carolina student-athletes earned spots on the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a recognition that requires a cumulative GPA of at least 3.0 for the year.

As the nation's premier leadership development program in collegiate athletics, the *Richard A. Baddour Carolina Leadership Academy* develops, challenges and supports student-athletes, coaches and staff in their continual quest to become world-class leaders in athletics, academics and life.

The *Richard A. Baddour Leadership Academy* provides comprehensive and cutting-edge leadership development programming through interactive workshops, 360-degree feedback, one-on-one coaching, peer mentoring and educational resources.

The *Richard A. Baddour Carolina Leadership Academy* offers four programs for student-athletes :

CREED Program

Leadership training begins in the freshman year. All leadership begins with personal leadership, therefore freshmen are taught skills to effectively lead themselves. Training consists of monthly meetings featuring keynote speakers and small group discussion. Upperclass student-athletes serve as peer mentors and discussion leaders. Special focus is on responsibility, accountability, making good choices, ethics and character building.

Rising Stars Program

Designed for a select group of "high potential" sophomores and juniors, the program provides future leaders with insights, strategies and skills necessary to become effective leaders. The program includes monthly meetings, interactive exercises and action learning experiences.

GAP Year Program

This level of involvement is slotted between Rising Star and possible Veteran Leader participation. It is an opportunity for continued leadership reflection and application. Leadership reflection entails case study or leadership articles, and leadership application involves an authentic project.

Veteran Leaders Program

This program is designed for team captains and veteran student-athletes. It provides advanced leadership training and support, teaches the critical skills and insights necessary to be effective vocal leaders and provides a strong peer network. Student-athletes meet regularly to learn and reinforce leadership principles as well as share successes, frustrations and lessons.

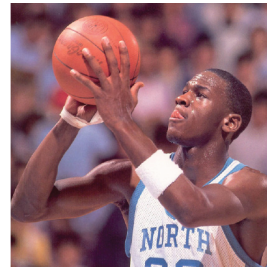
